## The Call To Speak Openly From A Life Of Integrity

Deaconeo Eucharisteo Apekdekomai **Keiruso** Tikto

Isaiah 61:1-3; Romans 10:5-17; 2 Cor. 4:1-6

It seems that God has ordained a “noisy” plan by which to redeem his creation! Nearly 90 times in the New Testament and the LXX (Septuagint) the Greek word *keirusso* is used, translated “proclaim” or “preach” or “make known.” Today we consider the important relationship between our personal sanctification and the Message: to whom it is to come, in what posture it is to be delivered, and the content of this life-changing message. Make some noise.
