

Our spiritual growth is susceptible to:

I. Hindrance – "who did hinder" (v.7)

It effects the:

- A. Steady— "Ye did run well"
- **B.** Stumbling "hinder you that you should"
- C. Stopped "that you should not obey the truth"
- II. Heresy "This persuasion comes" (vs. 8-10)

 It is:
 - A. Phony "comes not of Him that calls you"
 - B. Permeating "a little leaven leavens the whole lump"
 - C. Punishable "he that troubles you will bear his judgment"
- III. Harassment "why do I yet suffer persecution" (vs. 11-12) It doesn't:
 - A. Verify "If I yet preach circumcision"
 - **B.** Value "then is the offense of the cross ceased"
 - C. Vacate "would they were even cut off which trouble you"

Sentence Sermon:

"Our spiritual growth is hindered when we glory in something other than the cross of Christ."
