# **Taking Gathered Worship Home**

Stay here and wait! The disciples were ready for the culmination of all history, or so they thought. Let's go!! Instead they are told to wait. Jesus, risen King of all Creation, has defeated death but instead of leading them to the heights of earthly power, He ascends to His heavenly throne, promising to send them power to be His witnesses. So they wait not by sitting around, but by praying together. They trusted God to do what only He could by doing what they could in faith.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to meet with Jesus. Ask Christ to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

## **Sunday AM**

READ Acts 1:12-26; John 17:1-11. DICUSS, Why is our unity important? What does it mean to be unified in prayer? Compare and contrast these disciples with the Church today. PRAY for God to unite us in prayer for His Kingdom work each day.

#### **Sunday PM**

READ **John 20:24-31**; **Romans 15:4-7**. What are we supposed to do with God's Word? How does it work in us? PRAISE God for giving us this gift. REPENT of ways we disobey and disrespect His Word.

## **Monday**

READ Acts 1:12-14; Romans 15:1-6. DISCUSS, How did their united prayer demonstrate faith? How does obedience train us? PRAY for your neighbors, peers, friends & family asking God to show them His glory in Christ.

## **Tuesday**

READ **Acts 1:12-14**; **John 17:11**. DISCUSS, How is Jesus' prayer being answered by the Father? How should that motivate us? PRAY, "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. *Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven*. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

#### Wednesday

READ Acts 1:15-22; Second Timothy 3:16-17. DISCUSS, What does the Scripture accomplish? How? MEDITATE on the astonishing gift of God's Word. REJOICE if you are a witness to Christ's sacrifice for you. PRAY, "Lord, thank You for giving us Your sacred Word. Help us to submit to Your authority."

### **Thursday**

READ Acts 1:23-26; Titus 1:5-9. DISCUSS, What is the role of an overseer? Why are they necessary for the Church's health? REJOICE in the certainty that Jesus is on His throne. PRAY, "Lord, enable to trust You and follow Your Holy Spirit's leading as we await Your return. Amen."

### **Friday**

READ **Acts 1:12-26**. How have you been growing in your understanding and application of this passage this week? REJOICE for Christ has not left us alone, but given us His promised Holy Spirit! PRAY for your neighbors who are deceived and unable to even see their own sin for what it really is. Pray for their repentance (and our continuing repentance). Pray that God will use you to bring them into His kingdom to the honor and praise of His name.

## Saturday

PREPARE today for the gathered worship service tomorrow.

READ **Acts 2:1-13**. Come to worship tomorrow expecting to hear from God and to learn more about our God together. Pray for God's glory to be more and more manifested in the Woodstock area. Pray that He will use us to extend His grace as we celebrate it together.
