The index doesn't estimate the cost of storing and feeding all the gifts, most of which are alive.

He was saved, and went on to faithfully serve the Lord. As he was traveling between ministry engagements the train he was riding crashed over a trestle and burned. He was trapped inside and died burned to death in that train wreck. The rescuers that pulled his lifeless body from the wreck also found his briefcase. Inside were the sheets of music he was writing on that trip. It is precious to know that his last recorded words, recovered from that wreckage were: "I Will Sing Of My Redeemer".
