 - A. Hunger a basic human need
 - B. Glory a tricky temptation
 - C. Presumption on the grace and goodness of Godthe greatest trap of all
 - D. Notice Jesus' response each time the authoritative Word of God
- III. The Garden of Eden Retold
 - A. Both Adam and Jesus are moved, by God, to a special location
 - B. Notice the differing starting points
 - C. Both are tempted with food
 - D. Both were tempted with improper glory and to presume on the grace and goodness of God
 - E. Both could have overcome temptation with the revealed Word of God
 - F. The story of the temptation of Jesus is a continuation of the baptism and genealogy. Jesus is the new and better Adam, the sinless and victorious Son of God.
