*Where can you find joy?  
Deuteronomy 3:1-17*

***It is found through our:***

**I. Faith** – “the Lord said unto me, Fear him not” (vs. 1-5)

*Overcoming the:*

**A. Large** - “All these cities were fenced with high walls”

**B. Littles** – “beside unwalled towns a great many”

**C. Limiting** – “All these cities were fenced with...gates”

**II. Fortitude** – “we utterly destroyed them” (vs. 6-11)

*Doing things that are:*

**A. Historic** - “as we did unto Sihon king of Heshbon”

**B. Helpful** – “we took...the land that was on this side of Jordan”

**C. Hard** – “Og king of Bashan remained of the remnant of giants”

**III. Fortune** – “the land that we possessed at that time” (vs. 12-17)

*Benefitting through:*

**A. Requests** - “gave I unto the Reubenites and to the Gadites”

**B. Rewards** – “And I gave Gilead unto Machir”

**C. Restraint** – “which is the border of the children of Ammon”
