Zephaniah 2:3

SEEK MEEKNESS

I. Its identity

- A. Meekness is not:
- B. Literally meekness is to see oneself as lowly and base, to be broken, in the light of three truths.
 - 1. First, meekness arises from a correct understanding of oneself in light of God and His character.
 - 2. Second, meekness constantly arises from a correct understanding of one's depravity: sins and sinfulness (Canons V-2).
 - 3. Third, meekness arises from a clear understanding of grace and its undeservedness.

II. Its incentives.

- A. God resists (hates) the proud (Prov. 6;16; 8:13; 16:15).
 - 1. God sets Himself in battle array against self-centeredness; which opposition is immediate and constant.
 - 2. God hates it because nothing makes us more like Satan than to think of ourselves more highly than we ought.
 - 3. And God hates anything which destroys the unity of His Son's body.
- B. Meekness makes us look like (reflect) Jesus more than anything else (Phil. 2:5ff).
- C. God promises grace to the humble (Ps. 34:18; 51:17; 147:3; James 4:6) and to the contrite (Isa. 57:15).
- D. God promises blessings to the meek.
- III. Let us cultivate meekness in ourselves. Things to consider:
 - A. Consider God, His majestic greatness seen in His incommunicable attributes, in His creative works, in His redemptive work.
 - B. Consider Jesus who led the way to humility (Isa. 53:7; Phil. 2:5; Matt. 11:29; 21:5; Il Cor. 10:1)
 - C. Consider that our sins and sinfulness brought the Prince of glory to the cross.
