WE APPROACH THE LORD

Call to Worship

The central command of this familiar call to worship is a command to know, to reflect on our relationship to our covenant God. The psalm concludes with the reason: the character of the Lord and his faithfulness to his people.

Psalm 100^{ESV}

A Psalm for giving thanks.

- 1 Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth!
- 2 Serve the LORD with gladness!
Come into his presence with singing!
- 3 Know that the LORD, he is God!
It is he who made us, and we are his;
we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.
- 4 Enter his gates with thanksgiving,
and his courts with praise!
Give thanks to him; bless his name!
- 5 For the LORD is good;
his steadfast love endures forever,
and his faithfulness to all generations.

* Reading from the Law

In this passage Paul urges us to put to death what is earthly in us, without leaving us in doubt of what he means. As he continues he uses a metaphor of clothing to picture what we must “put on” in place of that which we have put to death.

Silent Confession of Sin

Corporate Confession of Sin

This hymn, particularly in its third verse, reflects on our sin and praises our Savior for rescuing us from it through the cross.

WE REJOICE IN THE ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

This doxology from the end of Jude, often used as a benediction to close a service, speaks of the power of God through Christ to cleanse us from sin and present us blameless in his presence.

Jude 24–25 ^{ESV}

Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great joy, ²⁵ to the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen.

Leader: This is the gospel.

Congregation: Hallelujah!

* Hymn of Assurance

This hymn speaks to us of the ground of our assurance: the work of Christ, in both his active and passive obedience.
