☐ Why should I, as a Christian, be concerned about sin?
In light of Romans 6, we need to answer this question by talking about five things:
1. Antinomianism

The glorious truth of the gospel (that we are saved by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone), from the beginning, has brought up the question of whether we need to be concerned about sin.

 ☐ Should Christians be concerned about whether they live a life of sin? (1) ☐ Should Christians be concerned about whether they commit any sin? (15)

	Why sin when obedience brings enjoyment of God? (22-23) – John 15:10-11
