1. Its Substitutionary Natu

(1) The Jews were absolutely blind to this! "Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God and afflicted."

- (2) Substitution presented in three ways:
 - -1- Christ willingly, actively became our substitute v.4 "He (Himself) has borne our griefs cf. v.7 and carried our sorrows"
 - -2- Christ passively endured the judgment due us v5 "He was wounded for our transgressions,

 He was bruised for our iniquities."
 - **-3- His sacrifice was the** *purposed plan of God* v.6 "And the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all."

2. The Sin that Made It Necessary

- (1) Sin as to its effects and consequences its fruit v.4 "griefs" or "sicknesses" "sorrows"
 - manifold sicknesses, innumerable sorrows
 - All sickness, all sorrow finds its source and cause in sin.
- (2) Sin as to its <u>character</u> v. 5
 - -1- rebellion "transgressions"
 - -2- distortion, perversion "iniquities"
 - -3- hostility, animosity toward God "the chastisement for our peace"
 - -4- a soul-destroying disease "we are healed"

(3) Sin at its <u>root</u>, its <u>essence</u> v. 6

-1- True of all humanity "All we like sheep have gone astray"

-2- True of each individual "We have turned, every one, to his own way"

3. The Divine Judgment in it Described

- (1) "stricken, smitten by God and afflicted"
- (2) "wounded" = "pierced through"
 - transfixed as with a fatal thrust, a fatal blow
 - cf. Ps. 22; Zech. 12:10
- (3) "bruised" = "crushed"
- (4) "chastisement"
- (5) "stripes" or "scourging"
- (6) "The LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all" has caused to "fall on Him."
 - cf. Solomon's commanded executions of treasonous characters "he fell upon him"
 - cf. King David's command (2 Sam. 1:15): "Go, cut him down!"
