Membership Does Matter

 "The Greatest motivation we could ever find for being passionately committed to the Church is that Jesus is passionately committed to the Church."

Arguments for Church membership

- 1. The Pattern of Acts (Acts 2:41) "So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls."
- 2. The Meaning of the Word "Added" "To place together" (Acts 2:41, 47)
- 3. The Joint Responsibility of the Church to Choose Officers Acts 6:3 "Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report."
- 4. The Joint Responsibility of the Church to Guard Doctrine 1 Timothy 3:15 "the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth."

Arguments for Church membership

- 5. The Requirement for Every Believer to be in Submission to Specific Leaders – Heb. 13:17 "Obey them that have rule over you."
- 6. The Demands of Local Church Discipline 1 Cor. 5:7 "Purge out the old leaven."
- 7. The Body Metaphor Makes It Obvious that There Is to Be a Clear Connection of Believers to Each Other in the Assembly – 1 Cor.

1. Commit to the doctrine & covenant of the church

- 2. Worship faithfully (Hebrews 10:25)
- 3. Serve actively (Use your gifts to serve the body!)
- 4. Minister to one another
 - Practice the one anothers of Scripture
 - If one member suffers, all the members suffer with it

(1 Corinthians 12:26)
