# I. General Introduction to Lamentations

- -Title: Hebrew: 'Alas!' 'How!' 'Elegies', 'Lamentations'; Greek: 'Dirges', 'Laments'—a song expressing grief and mourning for someone who has died; Latin: 'Tears', 'Lamentations'; Vulgate: 'The Lamentations of Jeremiah the Prophet', from which comes the title in our English Bibles
- -Author and Date: Jeremiah the prophet, soon after 586 BC (2 Chron. 35:25; Jer. 7:29; Lam. 3:48)
- -Theme/Purpose: mourning, confession, hope
- -Structure:

- II. Anger of Jehovah (ch. 2)
- III. Grief of Jeremiah (ch. 3)
- IV. Siege of Jerusalem (ch. 4)

### II. General Overview of Lamentations

#### III Prominent Themes in Lamentations

- -God's Attributes: wrath (1:5, 12, 15, 18; 2:1, 17, 21, 22); sovereignty (3:37, 38); goodness (3:25); mercy, compassion, faithfulness (3:22, 23-25, 32)
- -Divine Judgment Against Sin (1:8, 20; 3:42, 43; 4:6, 13, 22; 5:16)
- Hope in God's Compassion (3:22-25, 31-33)

## IV. Christ in Lamentations

- -In the Prophet (Matt. 23:37; Luke 13:34; 19:41; Lam. 1:16; 2:11; 3:48)
- -In the Prophecy (1:12; 2:15, 16; 3:14, 19, 30; see also Ps. 22; Is. 53)
- V. Practical Lessons in Lamentations
- 1) Jeremiah teaches us how to deal with pain and suffering (Lam. 3:20-25, 31-33).
- 2) The judgment of God that fell upon Jerusalem reminds us of the judgment that will fall upon those who refuse to repent of their sins.

- 4) Lamentations reminds us of the faithfulness of God.
