- I. John O's self-esteem story (truth-humility). Self-related-truths that deeply affect your life.
 1. Change of mood –stops and says its true of you (assurance rises and falls, but the reality does not)
 2. What should be true is true.
 - a. By this we know that we have come to know him. God fulfills his covenant - perfects
 - b. John's theology allows him to do this – this will all be true of you. [the very thing that makes the test a valid test makes it true that a Christian will pass it]
 3. Who? Ages or maturity. Children, Fathers, Young men
 4. The truth of these things is the absolute necessary foundation of hope and encouragement in the Christian life
 - a. If these things are not true, you might as well give up. But they are true 3:3
