## **Rev 3:14-22** The GOOD for NOTHING CHURCH

PRELIMS. These words are part of the **last canonical words** of Christ to His Church! As usual, He is doing so in **tender love!** This is the one Church about which Jesus has **nothing good** to say! He said good things about all the other churches but not Laodicea! He **can't** say "You have kept My word" as Phila; or "you have a few names in Sardis, people who have not soiled their garments"; or "I know your love and faith and service" to Thyatira! He has **nothing** good to say about them! Yet they were **still** a **Church!** Like all the others, they were still in **His hands!** Isn't that encouraging? In fact, it was **because** Jesus **loved** them He wrote to them in such endearing terms "Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous" [19] He is appealing to them **because** of the **covenant relationship** He has with them! They are still 'special' to Him!

<u>APP</u> So a Church that is rebuked by X, is a Church still, and is still the 'apple' of God's eye. How does that **impinge** upon ourselves at Dens Road Church? Do we consider ourselves to be rebuked or chastened by our Saviour? In what way, in what areas? Are we **sensitive** to God's voice of rebuke?

In rebuking Laodicea, X specifically calls Himself the "Amen (=truly)...faithful and true witness" [14] possibly to convey that He knows absolutely everything about them, "I know your works", 'I know what you are doing and what you are up to, and how you really spend your time! I will not hold anything back in My judgment upon you'!

A special reason for calling Himself the "beginning of God's creation" [14]. Just 'down the road', the church at Colosse had a philosophical problem regarding the Person of Christ. They said X was created and not the Creator! Paul wrote to correct the errors of that philosophy, saying that "by Him (Christ) all things were created...(and) He is before all things and in Him all things hold together" [Col 1:16,17] Paul added at the end of that letter "when this letter has been read among you, have it also read in the church of the Laodiceans" [Col 4:16]! So there were probably still

some in Laodicea who were still a little affected by that error!

<u>APP</u> And in applying that to today there still are Mormons/JWs/
Cults who distort the Person of Christ and the Holy Spirit!

Finally, Jesus says "I know your works"! Notice, He did **not** say, 'I know your **faith!** for faith without works is dead! Faith that does not lead to a changed life, is not the real faith!

## **COLD or HOT?**

Generally people take 'hot' to mean 'Godly enthusiasm', and 'cold' to mean 'ungodly antagonism'! But that does <u>not</u> square with "Would that you were <u>either</u> cold or hot"![15] There is another interpretation. Cold and hot refer to two positive things, not one positive and one negative! A Church is either <u>theologically centred/oriented</u>! A Church that is theologically centred attract those who are interested in the intellect, on doctrine, teaching and are 'big' on a long list of what you must <u>believe!</u> The 'cold' Truth! A Church that is practically centred, is not so 'fussy' about what you believe as on what you <u>do</u> and on other activities, the Youth Group, the Camps, the Music, the Worship! Warm hearted! Eg, the Reformed Church is heavy on ministries to various groups and healings and helping the poor, etc. Every church gravitates toward one or the other of these two.

Now geographically, Laodicea was between Colosse and Hierapolis. Colosse was watered by the **icy streams** coming down from the high mountains which surrounded it. People were refreshed by its cold clear water. Hierapolis on the other hand was famous for its **hot mineral springs** and people were **healed** by **bathing** in its hot mineral springs! So both cities were known for its refreshing, soothing, healing assets. Laodicea was in the centre! Seemingly both these waters met at the bottom of a cliff and the water there was lukewarm and was avoided by all as it was distasteful! So there was a **'play'** on the **geographical** location of Laodicea and its produce for the people. It was well-known that **no** one **benefited** from the warm Laodicean waters.

## THREE GREAT RESOURCES

Yet it had a great number of very **useful resources!** It **could** and **should** have been the most **productive** and **best** Church of all! (1) It was a great **Banking/Financial Centre.** In AD61 devastated by an earthquake – but refused Roman government help as it had enough to build the city from its own resources! Thus "*I need nothing*"[17] It was said 'it doesn't even need God'!! <u>APP</u> What a <u>curse</u>, yes, curse, money can be! It certainly does not guarantee calmness, peace, joy and rest. Ask Paul **McCartney** with £825m!! Laodicea as well as many wealthy billionaires do need God!

- (2) Laodicea had **manufactured clothing**, its **wool** was world famous. It prided itself in being able to clothe many people and yet it did **not** know that it needed to be **clothed** so the **shame** of its **nakedness** would not be seen [18]! We may be well-dressed on the outside, but inside, in your soul, you need the **spiritual** "white garments" of Christ's righteousness! The Church in the OT "I will greatly rejoice in the LORD; my soul shall exult in my God, for he has **clothed** me with the **garments** of **salvation**; he has **covered** me with the **robe** of **righteousness**" [Isa 61:10]
- And (3) Laodicea was a famous **medical centre**. World famous for **ointment** for the **ears**, and **ointment** for the **eyes**! Seemingly it was very self-conscious of its medical skills, y et it did **not** know it needed "salve to anoint" its **own eyes** "so that you may see" [18c]. That is, see the **spiritual dimension** in life! Many have an **eye** for **business**, for the opposite **sex**, but lack eyes for **spiritual beauty**!

Laodicea had these three resources but <u>misused</u> them – in the sense that they **omitted** to **apply** them to themselves in regard to their **relationship** to the God who gave them these resources! All the skills and gifts <u>you</u> have must be used for the **glory** of **God**.

<u>Great Lesson</u>: an accumulation of the riches, wealth, honour, pleasures, actually <u>dulls</u> the <u>mind/understanding</u> toward the <u>most important</u> aspects of our lives – our <u>relationship to God/maker!</u> A <u>multitude</u> of 'good' things <u>distorts reality</u> in such a way that

spiritual things become either a non-entity or unimportant! Fact! There is a <u>real power</u> in matter! Look "<u>not realising</u> that you <u>are</u> wretched, pitiable, poor, blind and naked"[17] So true!! Laodicea did not realise these things about itself. It was this <u>self-sufficiency</u> which caused Jesus to say "I will spit you out of my mouth"[16]! Strong language as strong as you will get anywhere in the Bible! Because God truly hates hypocrisy!

## **The INVITATION**

The invitation was to **repent!** It was a 'call' to take an **honest look** at themselves! You just **cannot repent**, **without** having an honest look at yourself! But it was a look at themselves in the **context** of their **relationship** to God! They were in **covenant** with God – else they would not be in the Church! They were **not pagans**? They were very likely all **baptised** in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit – yet they needed to **repent**. Nothing has changed! Same today – churches are full of people who need to repent.

A generation of believers who only **half-believe!** Who know a lot about X and believe a lot about X, but are not **committed** to X! As X said to Church at Phila there are those "who <u>say</u> they are Jews and are not" in the **spiritual** sense! [3:9] Paul "I want you to know how great a struggle I have for you and for those at Laodicea…as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so <u>walk</u> in Him" [Col 2:1,6] Paul was <u>concerned</u> that they were **not** <u>walking</u> as Xns!!

The invitation was an invite from Jesus to **renew** the **relationship** and to have **dinner together** with Jesus! Jesus knew there was **no real** relationship together. You can't 'kid' Jesus that you are in a relationship, when you are not! Amazing: Jesus **does want** your fellowship! He really does want **you** to **open** the door to Him! He is standing there right now! The amazing thing is that even those who have **broken their relationship** with Him, have Him outside their door again (that is why the door is closed) and He is asking to come in – because **He** would **love** to have your company again!! Anyone here today, who is **not walking** with the Lord? Anyone here today "who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says..."!
