- C. Don't envy your wicked neighbor. v. 31-35 23:17 24:1,19 Psalm 73:1ff 37:1ff

IV. If you act wisely towards God and men you will succeed in life. v. 2,4,14-26,32-35

- A. The wise are greatly blessed. v. 2,4, 14-26

- **B.** Does Proverbs promise too much?
 - 1. The wise do not always enjoy material wealth and long life. The wicked sometimes prosper. v. 31 Ps. 73:1ff 37:1ff Job 1:1ff
 - 2. Proverbs contains maxims which describe the way life generally works in God's world. These are not promises which can be unconditionally "claimed".
 - 3. Proverbs reflects the covenant blessings and curses to the nation of Israel under the Old Covenant. <u>v. 33</u> Lev. 26:3ff <u>Dt. 28:1ff</u>
 - 4. Proverbs portrays the ultimate (eschatological) blessings to the righteous and curses upon the wicked in God's kingdom. v. 33-35,18 <u>2:21-22</u> 23:17-18 12:28 Ps. 37:29 Mt. 5:5 Rev. 22:14
 - 5. What Adam and Eve lost, Jesus has regained. v. 18 Gen. 2:9 Rev. 22:2,14 2:7

V. Concluding Applications: Christ has come to give us wisdom and life.
