## FAITH THAT PLEASES GOD

Hebrews 10:35-11:6

## I. FOUNDATIONAL FAITH (11:1, 6)

**A.** <u>Definition of Faith</u> (11:1; 2 Cor 5:7)—believing in the reality of something that can't be seen

- **B.** <u>Essential Faith</u> (11:6)—foundational to everything else
  - 1. God Exists (11:3)—His claim as Creator
  - **2.** God <u>Rewards</u> (10:35-36, 11:2)
    - a. It is possible to please Him. (Jer 29:13; Mat 7:7-11)
    - b. He is worth pleasing. (Ps 63:1, 3)

**C.** <u>Saving Faith</u> (10:38; Hab 2:4; Rom 3:28; Eph 2:8-10; Tit 1:16; Jam 2:18-20, 26)—

1. It is not <u>our good works</u> that save us but <u>Christ's work</u> that saves us. (Rom 3:28; Isa 64:6)

**2.** Our good works are the <u>result</u>, not the <u>cause</u> of our salvation. (Eph 2:8-10; Gal 2:20)

3. The <u>righteous</u> life is a <u>life of faith</u>. (Gal 2:20)

**4. Faith that does not produce good works is not saving faith.** ((Tit 1:16; Jam 2:18-20, 26)

## II. <u>LIVING FAITH</u> (10:35-39)—

A. <u>Confidence</u> (10:23, 35)—sure, certain, solidly convinced, rely upon

- 1. In the Truth of Christianity (10:23)
  - a. The Authority of Scripture—OT prophecy of the Messiah
  - **b.** The Message of the Gospel—Fulfillment of prophecy in Christ
  - c. The Certainty of Christ's Promise—power, authority, credibility

**2.** In the <u>Return of Christ</u> (10:37; Isa 26:20; Hab 2:3-4)—Our confidence is anchored in the eternal perspective of history.

**B.** <u>Endurance</u>(10:36)—fortitude, strength, patience to stand firm and persevere in adversity

**1. We <u>will experience tribulation</u> in this world.** (Jn 16:33; 2 Tim 3:12)— you know what to expect

2. The <u>duration</u> of trial is limited. (10:37)—won't last forever

3. The reward will be worth the trouble. (2 Cor 4:16-18)—

C. <u>Action</u> (10:36)—Faith is observable; it is evidenced by action.

- 1. Faith has implications for every aspect of life.
- 2. Faith determines loyalties and priorities.
- 3. Faith guides our decisions and course of action.
- **III. EXAMPLES OF FAITH** (Heb 11)—the faith of Abel and Enoch pleased God
  - A. Abel's Offering (11:4; Gen 4:1-12)—
    - 1. Abel's faith <u>still speaks</u>.
    - 2. Faith is <u>necessary</u> to please God.

**3.** The unrighteous will <u>persecute</u> the righteous. (Mat 5:10-12; 2 Tim 3:12; 1 Pet 4:12)

B. Enoch's Rapture (11:5; Gen 5:21-24)—

**1. Enoch "walked with God."**—fellowship, friendship, like-mindedness; life of prioritized time invested in the relationship

2. Enoch did not experience death.—reward
