I. Protection - "who is he who will harm you" (vs. 13-15)

Being prepared to:

- A. Suffer "if you suffer for righteousness sake"
- B. Sanctify "sanctify the Lord God in your hearts"
- C. Speak "be ready always to give an answer"
- II. Process "suffered for sins, the just for the unjust" (vs. 16-20)

 Being persistent with our:
 - A. Conscience "Having a good conscience"
 - **B.** Calling " if the will of God be so, that ye suffer"
 - *C. Contentment* "the longsuffering of God waited"
- III. Provision -"by the resurrection of Jesus Christ" (vs. 21-22)

 Being proffered with:
 - A. Vindication "a good conscience toward God"
 - **B.** Vitality "Who is gone into heaven...right hand of God"
 - C. Victory "angels...authorities...powers...subject to Him"
