Opening thoughts on prayer

- There often is more prayer in a word-less prayer.
- > Prayer is the moving of your heart to God in various expressions
- > Jesus and Bible saints 'breathed prayer' yet had 'times of prayer'

THE REQUISITE PARTS OF TRUE PRAYER

I. True Prayer needs to come from the heart

- A. Scripture describes prayer as *crying* (Ps. 34:15, 17; 56:9; Matt. 15:22)
 - 1. Indicates a real need
 - 2. Will not be presented as a 'form prayer'
- B. Scripture also describes prayer as *extolling praising* (Ps. 145:1)

II. True prayer needs to be directed to God as He revealed Himself

- A. God revealed Himself in Scripture
 - 1. As a prayer-hearing God: Ps. 65:2
 - 2. As a holy God: Heb 12:28-29; Is. 6:1-3
 - 3. As a merciful and gracious God, ready to pardon (Ps. 86:5; Ex. 34:6-7)
 - 4. As the Almighty God, able to save: Is. 50:2
 - 5. As the sovereign God: Daniel 4:35
 - 6. As the wise God: 1 Cor. 1:25; 2 Cor. 12:9

III. True prayer needs to cover the right subjects

A. Prayer is not presenting our personal wish list as if to a Divine Servant

IV. True prayer needs to be expressed in spirit of humility

- A. How is humility defined?
- B. Humility is heightened by the sense of your real need due to sin

Final Thoughts ...

- A. Be encouraged to bring your broken prayers before God!
 - 1. God will never despise a broken and contrite heart (Ps. 51:17; 66:3)
 - 2. He hears though He may not answer yet (Matt. 15:22-23)
- B. Be encouraged for the Mediator will perfect all prayers laid in His hands before He presents them to His Father (Heb. 7:25)
- C. Be encouraged to begin each day with prayer (Ps. 63:1, 8)

TRUTHS ABOUT PRAYER

Prayer is not the submitting of our needs to God but submitting ourselves to Him.
