You may have walked by the homes of Socrates, Plato and Aristotle. Then you may have been introduced to the gods of Greek mythology, like Zeus, Apollo and Narcissus. For sure you could have conversed with the epicureans and stoics. No doubt you would have come to the same conclusion as Paul, “Men of Athens, I observe that you are very religious in all respects.”

Application:

1. Are there parallels between what the Athenians believed and what people believe today? Discuss them.
2. Why are people ready to accept anything that might sound spiritual, yet refuse Christ? Read 2 Cor. 4:3-4
3. You might hear someone today speak not of Christianity, but spirituality; Jesus, but not the church. Can we divide spirituality from Christianity and Jesus from the church?
4. True or False—Jesus did not come to improve our spirituality, but to save us from our sins? True or False—you cannot have Jesus without His body, the church, and spirituality without Christianity is an empty shell?
5. The Athenians were a pluralistic society. What is pluralism and does it affect the church today? How?
6. Where do you stand concerning other beliefs—uncritical, uncaring or unprepared or are you discerning, caring and ready?
7. What are you doing to prepare yourself to be a better fisher of men?
