## **God's Perfect Will**

(Topical Message)

Introduction: When we speak of God's will, we are speaking about what He wants; What does God want for our lives?	
There	are two major aspects to the will of God:  1. God's <u>desired</u> will  2. God's <u>decreed</u> will
•	Principles regarding God's will in the lives of His children:
l.	God is concerned about the significant details of your life - Luke 12:6-7
II.	God has a specific plan & purpose for you to fulfil  Examples: Jeremiah - Jeremiah 1:5 & Paul – Gal. 1:15
III.	God's will is not a "bitter medicine" Psalm 16:11
IV.	God's will is knowable and doable - Eph 1:18-19
V.	God never leads a person contrary to His Word - Psalm 119:35
VI.	God only moves those who are in motion for Him; He does not steer parked cars Acts 13:2
VII.	God gives you the desire and ability to do whatever He wants you to do Php 2:13

## How do I know that my decision is the will of God?

Ask yourself the following questions before making the choice:	
1. Am I presently & actively doing both the moral and general will of God for my life?	
2. Have I <u>prayed to God</u> about this decision? - Proverbs 3:5,6	
3. Do I need Godly counsel (advice) about this decision? - Proverbs 12:15	
4. <b>Do I have a solid Bible reason to justify this decision? -</b> Psalm 119:105	
5. What is really motivating my decision making process? Lot: an example of a man who made bad choices (Genesis 13:9-13)	
6. Which of my choices should be my <u>priority</u> ? -Mt 6:33	
7. Which of my choices would most please & glorify God? -Eph 5:10	
8. What would be the <u>long-term effects</u> of my choice? - <i>Pr 14:12</i>	
9. Do I have <u>peace</u> about my decision? - <i>Phil. 4:7</i>	
Conclusion:	
If we fight against God's will, we will not succeed, but will fail miserably.
