LORD'S DAY 12b (Isa. 61: 1-6 Acts 11: 1-26)

## BLESSEDNESS OF THE TRUTH: CHRISTIAN, THE OFFICE OF BELIEVER

Intro: - Our instructor asks, "But why art thou called a Christian?" Christian is the most beautiful name of God's people. Our best name.

- We are called "Abraham's seed" because we are partakers of Abraham's faith, and "disciples" because we are followers of Christ.

Songs: 226 217 425 243 397

- In Isa. 61 we are called "trees of righteousness, the planting of the LORD" (vs.3) and "Priests of the LORD" (vs.6).
- We have many more names, but "Christian" is the most precious!

## I. HOW WE GOT THE NAME. At Antioch.

- A. A name of ridicule.
  - 1. The name Christian did not originate with believers themselves, but by their enemies, meant as a name of reproach.
  - 2. Probably not from the Jewish enemies. They would call them Nazarenes, a derogatory term (Acts 24:5).
  - 3. Most likely coined by the unbelieving Greeks, to distinguish Jesus' followers from the Jews.
  - 4. Here we see the folly of Satan intending to abuse God's people with this term, but God meant it for good.
- B. A name claimed and loved.
  - 1. It is a name that identified these believers with him who was plainly the central figure in their message.
  - 2. It was a name too beautiful to be allowed to die.
  - 3. It is a name claimed; a noble testimony to the high regard, love and honor we have for Christ: dwelling on his name.
  - 4. As it is an honor for a child to be named after a loved one, what an honor to be named after our Savior!
- C. Blessedness of the name:
  - 1. Unity with Christ: his life is our life, his goods are our goods, his honor is our honor, his name is our name.
  - 2. We are by grace those who hear and love the good tidings to the meek:
  - 3. We are those who receive beauty for ashes, oil for mourning, a garment of praise for a garment of heaviness.
  - 4. Do you, do I love and rejoice in our name: Christians?

## II. WHAT THE NAME MEANS.

- A. Christian: a name that not only is beautiful, but significant: means that we have been anointed and are the anointed ones.
  - 1. We share the anointing of Christ.
  - 2. As we read in Ps. 133 of the oil upon the head runs down upon the beard and garments, so Christ's anointing is ours.
  - 3. You will remember that it is not the symbol but the reality: the ointment of the Holy Spirit. (I John 2:20,27)
  - 4. It is an anointing to an office: the office of believer. Young and old, male and female, Jew and Gentile hold this office.
- B. When were we anointed?
  - 1. We were elected to this office: In eternity God chose us and gave us to Christ to be saved.
  - 2. In our regeneration, we became living members of Christ: "I live, yet not I, but Christ liveth in me (Gal.2:20)."
  - 3. The symbol of that anointing is given to us in our baptism.
  - 4. Ministers of the Gospel administer the external sign, it is Christ alone effects the reality through the power of the HS.
  - 5. This was decisive in the work of Peter, and opened the door to a rapid advance of the Gospel among the Gentiles.
  - 6. God calls his people to this office and strengthens them for this office in the preaching of the Word. Acts 11:20,21).
- C. Sharing Christ's anointing means:.
  - 1. First: that we have the right to hold this office of believer. God has chosen us and appointed us in his sov. grace.
  - 2. Second: that we have the might to carry out this difficult office. He strengthens us with his Word and Spirit
  - 3. It means that we are placed as visible representatives of God's covenant and Christ's kingdom.
  - 4. It means that we must be obedient servants of God, workers of his work and kingdom. Office means work!

## III. THE WORK THAT IT ENTAILS.

- A. The office of believer:
  - 1. We must believe and must continue to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God.
  - 2. As office-bearers, we have the calling to confess Jesus Christ, call on his name.
  - 3. As office-bearers, we must consecrate ourselves to holy service and life...
  - 4. As office-bearers, we must rule over our bodies, sighting sin and Satan. Life is not a playground, but a battlefield!
- B. The purpose of our service, our work is to bring glory to God our Redeemer.
  - 1. We honor Christ in the office of believer in which we are called to a three-fold function as prophet, priest, and king.
  - 2. To bring glory to God must be our goal, our aim in all that we say and do. Servants of the servant (Phil. 2:7).
  - 3. In all this we must say, "We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do (Luke 17:10)."
  - 4. We desire to hear him say, "Well done good and faithful servants, enter into the joy of thy Master (Matt. 25:21)."
- C. The question: "Why art thou called Christian?"
  - 1. Alas, many bear the name but lack the fact: nominal Christians, Sunday Christians.
  - 2. How awful to have borne the name because baptized in his name, but never knowing ever the living reality.
  - 3. O Spirit, unite us to Christ and cause his anointing oil to flow over us too. Christians: Anointed ones to office!
  - 4. May we be found faithful.
