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**Title:** [The Dialogue *cont'd.*] Job's Final Rejoinder (part 3) & Introducing Elihu.

**Text**: Job 31 & 32

## **Introduction:**

- 1. Job 31 is Job's declaration of his innocence.
- 2. Job 32 Introduces Elihu.
- I. Job Presents His Purity (Ch. 31:1-4)
- II. <u>Job Presents His Just Dealings</u> (Ch. 31:5-8) [against dishonesty]
- **III. Job Presents His Fidelity** (Ch. 31:9-12) [against adultery]
- IV. <u>Job Presents His Equity</u> (or fairness or impartiality) (Ch. 31:13-15) [against oppression]
- V. <u>Job Presents His Benevolence to the Poor</u> (Ch. 31:16-23) [against neglect of the poor]
- VI. Job Presents His Pure Worship (or his stand against covetousness & idolatry) (Ch. 31:24-28)
- VII. <u>Job's Presents His Love for People</u> (not revengeful and hospitality) (Ch. 31:29-32)
- **VIII. Job Presents His Repentance** (Ch. 31:33) He was not like Adam who hid himself.
  - **IX. Job Presents His Appeal to God** (Ch. 31:34-40) [against hypocrisy & exploitation]
  - **X. Introducing Elihu** (Ch. 32:1-5) A minor prose section to introduce Elihu.

## **Conclusion:**

- 1. Job's final testimony was his strongest denial of hidden or public sins.
- 2. Job feels that his misery was undeserved.
- 3. Job was pure in his love life, in how he acquired wealth, and his treatment of people.
- 4. Sins must be dealt with.
- 5. Job defeats infidelity by starting with the "look" (Pro. 6:25; Matt. 5:28).
- 6. The heart must be guarded with God's word and the application of it. Steps must be implemented.
- 7. Job maintained purity of worship (Many in his day were involved in nature worship).
- 8. God presence must be realized.
- 9. Elihu's contribution differed from Job's three friends: The three friends accused Job of sins, but Elihu confronts Job of his pride which was developed in his self-justification brought out by the sufferings which he endured, to exalt God and consider His works, and to fear God.
- 10. God does not include Elihu in His divine rebuke of Job's friends (42:7).
- 11. Elihu is aligned to the truth but seems to be ignored by God (God also does not respond to Satan, and to Job's wife).
- 12. The thesis of the three friends: Job you are suffering because of sinning. (Past)
- 13. The thesis of Elihu: Job in your suffering you are sinning. (Present) There is latent sin in every human heart. Suffering brings it out.
