 - -The overall concern of the vision to focus our attention upon the age-long conflict between the kingdom of God and the kingdoms of this world.
 - The final outcome isn't uncertain.
 - -Daniel's vision is a picture of the entire history of the Christian church.
- -The Roman Empire will break up into multiple kingdoms. They will eventually be succeeded by a king who opposes God and His people in a heightened way. God will destroy him. History will culminate with the triumph of the Lord and His people.
 - d. The Conclusion of the Vision (v. 28)
