The Scheme of Things

Ecclesiastes 7:13 - 8:1

- I. THE WORK OF GOD (13-14)—perfect but incomprehensible
 - A. God's Sovereignty (Isa 45:7)—God sends what comes to us.
 - 1. The Decrees of God (13)—immutable, established, perfect
 - 2. The Extremes of Life (14)—prosperity and adversity
 - B. <u>Our Response</u> (2 Sam 16:11-12)—respond accordingly
 - 1. <u>Appropriate</u>—fitting, suitable to the experience
 - **2.** Measured—consider the Source; God has done it
 - 3. **Humble**—God knows the plan but we don't
- **II.** THE STRUGGLE TO UNDERSTAND (15-28)—what is the order, design, plan, reason things work as they do?
 - **A.** The Elusive Pattern (23-25, 27-28)—bigger, more complex than he can figure
 - B. <u>Disturbing Discrepancies</u> (15b, 19)
 - 1. Behavior vs. Reward (15-19; Jn 9:1-3)—what we deserve vs. what we get
 - a. Righteousness vs. Wickedness (15, 16)—morality
 - **b. Wisdom vs. Foolishness** (16-19)—practicality, life skills
 - 2. Men vs. Women (26-28; Gen 3:16)—danger and bitter disappointment
 - **a. Consider the** *genre* (type of literature)—poetry/wisdom literature; observation, not explicit doctrine
 - **b.** Consider the <u>context</u> (surrounding text)—from the vantage point of his own *vain* (empty) life down here *under the sun*.

- **c.** Consider <u>Jesus</u> (the answer to Ecclesiastes)
- C. <u>Unhealthy Extremes</u> (16-18)
 - 1. Self-Righteous Wisdom (16)—legalistic piety; self-destruction
 - **2. Wicked Foolishness** (17)—godless and reckless living; madness
 - 3. <u>The Antidote</u> (18)—the fear of God—keeps from pride and lawlessness
- **C.** <u>Reality Check</u> (20-22; Rom 3:23)—*no one is righteous!* We were created to be righteous; observation and conscience tell us we don't measure up.
- III. <u>THE SCHEMES OF MEN</u> (29)—our plans and purposes in opposition to God's
 - **A.** <u>God's creation was good.</u> (Gen 1:31)—evidence remains
 - 1. The design was perfect.
 - 2. The product was perfect.
 - 3. The instructions were clear.
 - **B.** We have turned from His ways. (Ps 14:1-3; Jud 17:6; 21:25;)
 - 1. We defy our design. (Rom 1:21-32)—we are broken
 - 2. We choose our own way. (Isa 53:6)—we are lost
 - 3. We need a savior. (Isa 44:20)—our idols and our efforts can't save or fulfill us

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
