II. The flesh produces deeds according to its nature. v. 19-21

- A. The deeds (works) of the flesh are evident. v. 19a
 - 1. Though your inner nature/desires may be hidden, your deeds, which reveal your true nature, are plain for all to see.
 - 2. This is one of several lists of sins/vices. Rom. 1:18-32 Mark 7:21-22 1 Co. 6:9-10 2 Co. 12:20-21 Eph. 4:17-19 Col. 3:5-9 1 Th. 4:3-7 2 Tim. 3:2-5
 - 3. Why does Paul refer to that which the flesh produces as works, while the Spirit produces fruit?
 - 4. What is the purpose of this list of fleshly deeds?
 - 5. What kinds of sinful deeds are emphasized in this list? v. 15,26 1 Co. 3:3
 - 6. The words on this list have overlapping meanings.

E. Sins of the dissolute life. 5:21b

- 2. Carousing (wild parties). Rom. 13:13 1 Pe. 4:3
- 3. Do professing Christians actually act this way? 5:13 1 Co. 11:21
- 4. The Spirit gives you self control and higher desires for joy in the Lord. v. 22-23 Ps. 34:8 Isa. 55:1-2

III. Those who practice such fleshly deeds will not inherit the kingdom of God. v. 21b

- A. This list of sinful fleshly deeds is not comprehensive.
- B. Nor will every fleshly person practice each of these vices.
- C. Is Paul contradicting himself?
 - 1. He spent over four chapters teaching that we are saved (and receive the heavenly inheritance) by faith and not works. 2:16 3:29,18
 - 2. Now he seems to be saying that people will be judged by their works.
- D. Those who are truly saved will be inwardly transformed by the indwelling Spirit.
 - 1. Heirs of the kingdom of God have received a new spiritual nature and are no longer characterized by the fleshly deeds of the world. 1:4 1 Co. 6:9-11
 - 2. Those who remain enslaved to *practicing* fleshly deeds are not yet converted and remain under wrath. 6:8 Eph. 5:5 Col. 3:8 1 Co. 6:9-10
 - 3. There is no such category as a carnal/fleshly Christian. Ro. 8:5-6,13 Phil. 1:6 2 Co. 5:17
 - 4. Those who falsely think themselves to be heirs of heaven need to be warned. 2 Cor. 13:5 1 Jo. 2:3-4 Mt. 7:22-23

IV. Conclusion: How does this list of fleshly deeds impact our lives?

- A. We are thankful that God has delivered us from these ugly deeds through the gospel. 1:4 1 Pet. 4:3-4 Col. 3:5-7
- B. We have put to death the desires and the deeds of the flesh. v. 24
 - 1. In one sense the flesh has been decisively defeated through our union with Christ on the cross. 2:20 Ro. 6:6 Col. 2:20
 - 2. We are responsible to continually put to death the desires of our old nature. v. 17 Rom. 6:12-13 8:12-13 Mark 8:34 Luke 9:23
 - 3. This list helps us to identify that which we are putting to death. Ro. 8:12-13
 - 4. Different ones among us struggle with different fleshly desires.
 - 5. You experience the daily battle against the flesh with its works and desires.
- C. You understand better what it means to keep in step with the Spirit. v. 25,16,18 6:16 Ro. 4:12 Phil. 3:16
- D. You are thankful for Christ.
 - 1. Jesus was perfectly free from each of these fleshly deeds. 2 Co. 5:21 Heb. 4:16
 - 2. He atoned for our fleshly failures. 3:13
