Wise and foolish: Character and conduct (Part 1)

1. Two children: wisdom and fool (10:1-7)
 - A. Child # 1: A wise child brings joy to his father (v.1a)
 - B. Child # 2: A foolish child brings grief to his mother (1c)

I. The Wise Son (10:8a, 9a, 13a, 14a, 19b, 21a, 23b, 31a; 32a)

- A. Obedience to God's commands (10:8a)
- B. Life of integrity and security (10:9a)
- C. His words are edifying and lifegiving (v.11a, 13a, 19b, 20a, 21a, 31a)

II. The Foolish Son (10:8b, 9b, 10b 11b, 12a, 13b, 14b,15b 16b, 17b, 18b, 19a, 20b, 23a, 24a, 26, 27b, 28b, 29b, 30b, 31b)

- A. The mouth and the Words of the foolish
(8b, 10b, 11b, 14b19a, 31a, 32b)
- B. His behavior and the outcome of the wicked foolish life
(v.9b, 10a, 12a, 21b, 23a, 25a, 26, 27b, 28b, 30b)
- C. The complete and utter ruin of the foolish

What are You Meditating On? (Philippians 4: 8-9)

Last message: Be anxious for nothing (4:6-7)

1. Don't be anxious, be in prayer (4:6)
2. God's gift is peace in Christ Jesus (4:7)

I. These Are the Things We are to Meditate On (4:8)

“v 8c “meditate on these things.”

- A. *Whatever things are true.*
- B. *Whatever is noble.*
- C. *Whatever things are just.*
- D. *Whatever things are pure.*
- E. *Whatever things are lovely.*
- F. *Whatever things are of good report.*

“if there is anything praise worthy – meditate on these things”

II. The Importance of Following godly Examples (4:9)

“These things you learned & received and heard and saw in me”

“these things do... and the God of peace will be with you”
