I. The Situation in the Church...

- A. There was persecution... Acts 5:27ff
- B. The disciples were encouraged and joyful... Acts 5:42
- C. The church was growing... Acts 6:1 cf 2:41; 4:4; 5:14

Lesson: Satan is always on the attack... nevertheless...

II. The Particular Issue Raised...

A. The Hellenists complained...

- 1. They were Jews influenced by Greek culture...
- 2. Their widows were being neglected...
- a. The daily distribution (diakonea...)
- b. The neglect was not intentional or because of racial strife...

Observations:

- 1. The proclamation of the Gospel and teaching is central...
- 2. There are no 2nd rate Christians in the church...
- 3. It would be wrong to neglect the Word of God...
- 4. It would be incorrect to think the Apostles held a superior attitude... Mark 10:43-45

Lessons:

- 1. Jesus calls all of us to "diakonia..."
- 2. Leaders in the church are to be examples...
- 3. It is an issue of calling...

III. The Solution Proposed and Accepted...

A. Pick out seven men...

- 1. Of good report...
- 2. Full of the Spirit and wisdom...
- **B.** The church members choose... Acts 6:3b-5

Consider: These were good men... Stephen, Philip...

Observation: A problem created an opportunity and God richly blessed, vs. 7

IV. Our Premise Defended...

- A. Not everyone agrees...
- B. They fail to consider:
 - 1. These men are personally mentioned...
 - 2. They were elected and qualified...
 - 3. They were elected to a specific work...
 - 4. They were ordained to it... I Timothy 4:14; II Timothy 1:6; cf. Numbers 27:18
