1 Peter 1:10-12

For centuries God's prophets predicted that the Christ would come. But those prophets did not get to see the fulfillment of what they foretold. Men like Isaiah, Jeremiah, Daniel, and Zechariah lived in a time of prophetic
e They longed to see what they wrote about come to pass, but they did not see it, and they
also didn't fully understand it. They were hungry to know more about the Messiah. They had an intense
interest. It was their quest. Yet some details about the coming Christ remained a mystery. The full story of the
Messiah remained a treasure chest they just couldn't unlock.
Concerning this salvation, the prophets who prophesied about the grace that was to be yours searched and inquired carefully, inquiring what person or time the Spirit of Christ in them was indicating when he predicted the sufferings of Christ and the subsequent glories.

The Spirit-produced prophecies of the coming Christ in the OT included us all along! They were not just for the people of the prophets' day or for Israel only. They were for us! And the same Spirit who guided the prophets also empowered the people who brought the Gospel (the good news message about Jesus' death and resurrection for us) to us! See 1 Peter 1:23-25.

The angels have some kind of curiosity about what we have been given by God. Jesus took upon himself our n (not theirs) and suffered in our place for our sins (not the sins of the angels who sinned) that He might rescue us from the wrath we rightly deserve and restore us to God. See Hebrews 2:14-18.
Like John and Peter stooping to look into the empty tomb of the risen Lord Jesus, the angels have a strong desire to "stoop and look" into these things. While the angels are the curious spectators, we are the personal recipients of God's saving grace.
