¹⁴ You are the Light of the world (we are a reflector of the Light which comes from Christ). A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid (proper light will not, and in fact, cannot be hid).

¹⁵ Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick (the light is not to be hid); and it gives light unto all who are in the house (that is the purpose of the light).

¹⁶ Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works (proper Faith will always produce proper works, but proper works will never produce proper Faith), and glorify your Father which is in Heaven (proper works will glorify our Heavenly Father, while improper works glorify man).

Listen. We can't all be preachers or teachers, but we can all see the light within us, show the light before us, and shine the light beyond us. It is time for many of us to come out of the closet. We need to take our light out from under the bowl we have been hiding it under and put it on a lampstand where everybody can see it. Dr. D. James Kennedy was a great pastor of a church in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, and was the founder of the evangelism program known as "Evangelism Explosion." He told the story of being interviewed on a television station in a large American city by a young woman who was the co-anchor for the local evening news. He said she asked him several questions about living the Christian life in a secular culture. Near the end of the interview, she said, "There are a lot of people watching right now who don't really know what a Christian is or what **you** mean when **you** talk about being 'born again'. Why don't **you** explain that to them right now?" Dr. Kennedy was shocked, but he took advantage of the opportunity and explained what it meant to get out of spiritual darkness and come to the light of Jesus Christ and except Him as Lord and Savior. They broke for a commercial. He said as the newswoman and he were talking he said to her, "Are you sure this station is going to run this interview?" I can't believe that **you** just allowed me to share God's Plan of Salvation on this newscast. She smiled and said, "We just ran it. This is a live telecast." Dr. Kennedy He said, "Well, in that case, you might better be looking for a new job, because **you** may get fired." She laughed and said, "I won't be fired. I'll tell you why later, because we are back on in 10 seconds." When they came back from the commercial break and finished the interview and after the program was over, she said, "Dr. Kennedy, let me tell you why I am not worried about my job." She said, "Do you see that man over there behind the camera? Five years ago, Lled him to Jesus. My co-anchor, who is in the studio right now helping with this broadcast, Lled him to Jesus three years ago. The station manager who makes the final decision on all the things we broadcast - Lled him to Jesus two years ago. The owner of the station - Iled him to Jesus four years ago. You see, I'm not worried about losing my job. In fact, I would be worried about losing my job if I had not given you the chance to shine your light." Now that is what I am talking about. You cannot be light on the outside, until you have light on the inside, and everybody in this world, is either in the light, or they are in the dark. Jesus came to die on a cross for our sins, to take care of the darkness of sin and death, and came out of the grave three days later, so He could be to us the light of the world.
