- I. Session 72: The Truth of God Part 3: Application of integrity to our lives
  - a. <u>Review:</u> In the last two sessions we explore the attribute of the truth of God as taught in the Old and New Testament.
  - b. <u>Purpose:</u> In this session we shall study what Scripture has to say about integrity in our lives.
  - c. First know that lying and a lack of integrity is seen as an abomination in God's eyes
    - i. "For the devious are an abomination to the Lord; But He is intimate with the upright." (Proverbs 3:32)
      - 1. Devious involves mean deceptive, among other things.
      - 2. Note that God finds them "an abomination to the Lord"
    - ii. "Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord, But those who deal faithfully are His delight." (Proverbs 12:22)
      - 1. Here the subjects are "Lying lips."
      - 2. "Lying lips" here is again something that God doesn't approve for they "are an abomination to the Lord"
    - iii. "A false balance is an abomination to the Lord, But a just weight is His delight." (Proverbs 11:1)
      - 1. Even the instrument of lying such as "a false balance" is "an abomination to the Lord"
      - 2. Again this is strong language but it shows how much God hates lying and lack of integrity.
  - d. Secondly vow that you be willfully honest and upright: "Put away from you a deceitful mouth And put devious speech far from you." (Proverbs 4:24)
    - i. Willfully say "no" to lying.
    - ii. Then make a plan to help you be more honest.
  - e. Thirdly realize a lying tongue has consequences
    - i. The benefit of lying tongue is momentary: "*Truthful lips will be established forever, But a lying tongue is only for a moment.*" (Proverbs 12:19)
      - 1. The truth is that "a lying tongue is only for a moment."
      - 2. Notice the contrast: "Truthful lips will be established forever"
    - ii. There's consequences: "He who has a crooked mind finds no good, And he who is perverted in his language falls into evil." (Proverbs 17:20)
  - f. Pray to God that within your own heart you will have integrity: "Two things I asked of You, Do not refuse me before I die: 8 Keep deception and lies far from me," (Proverbs 30:7-8a)
    - i. Notice that verse 7 shows this is a prayer to God where the writer says "Two things I asked of You"
    - ii. The first prayer is that "Do not refuse me before I die" (Proverbs 30:7b)
    - iii. The second is a prayer concerning avoiding the lack of integrity: "*Keep deception and lies far from me*" (Proverbs 30:8a)
  - g. Pray that you will not be put in circumstances that forces you to violate your integrity: "Give me neither poverty nor riches; Feed me with the food that is my portion, That I not be full and deny You and say, "Who is the Lord?" Or that I not be in want and steal, And profane the name of my God." (Proverbs 30:8b-9)

- i. This is a continual prayer to God.
- ii. The petition is for "Give me neither poverty nor riches"
- iii. The reason is so that one does not forget God nor steal and profane His name.
- iv. Sometimes people violate their integrity to make more money in pursuit of wealth. Sometimes people act dishonestly to steal to survive but this also profane God's name.
- v. Pray that God would not put you in a circumstance that put your integrity in question.
- h. Meditate on God's Law: "I will meditate on Your precepts And regard Your ways." (Psalm 119:15)
  - i. Notice the importance of Christian meditating.
  - ii. When one meditate on God's laws it does check back the sin of dishonesty.
- i. Finally be encouraged that integrity pleases God as your motivation to live with integrity.
  - i. Don't forget the second line of Proverbs 12:22 in which after saying "Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord" we read this encouraging fact: "But those who deal faithfully are His delight." (Proverbs 12:22b)
  - ii. Don't forget the second line of Proverbs 11:1 in which after saying "A false balance is an abomination to the Lord" we read this encouraging fact: "But a just weight is His delight." (Proverbs 11:1b)
  - iii. So pursue integrity not because you have to but because you want to please God!
  - iv. The greatest motivation for wanting to please Him? Jesus and the Gospel!
