Cultivating Closeness

So, what comes to mind?

This is something that is...

- Deliberate, not accidental.
- Work, not a walk in the park.
- A process, not an accomplishment.
- Progressive, not instant.
- Started "below" the ground and moves "above" the ground.
- Addressing existing obstacles, not fantasizing about utopia.

This will require us to...

- Address the condition of the soil
- Give careful attention to the selection of the seed.
- Remain invested in the feeding and weeding process.

The condition of our "soil".

The nature of the soil itself.

...Our problem...

- 1. We were born sinners, Rom. 3:23.
- 2. As sinners were are spiritually dead, 1 Cor. 2:14.
- 3. As sinners we are incorrigibly selfish Eph. 2:1-4.

...Our Solution...

- 1. We must be born again, Eph. 2:5-9
- 2. We must continue to grow in Christ, Eph. 2:10.

The "buried debris" in the soil.

"He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh *them shall have mercy.*" Proverbs 28:13

What is this verse saying?

What do you mean by "buried debris"?

What can we do about it?

- Identify the symptoms.
 - Inability to trust.
 - Internal "walls".
 - Insurmountable sinful patterns.
- Identify the source.
 - Past violations of trust, "offenses".
 - Inability to find a solution or cure.
- Implement God's solution.
 - It is described in "surgical" terms.
 - It is identified as forgiveness, that is BIBLICAL forgiveness.

- It is explained with a word picture that reveals that it includes...
 - ...assessment.
 - ...confrontation.
 - ...cancellation.

The selection of the seed

The foundational principle.

"Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting.

And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not Gal. 6:7-9

The specific warning.

Why would we be deceived?

- The time between sowing and reaping.
- The difference in "appearance" between seed and fruit.

The specific identification.

"Nevertheless let every one of you in particular so love his wife even as himself; and the wife see that she reverence her husband." Eph. 5:33

Feeding and weeding

- This will require a new understanding and commitment to truth in communication.
- This will require a renewed and sacrificial commitment to invest the necessary time.

Communication

- The most recognized problem in cultivating closeness in marriage is communication, while the most reliable "tool" for cultivating closeness is communication.
- While progress in this area is never *easy*, it can in fact be *simplified* if we understand two basic truths.

These basic truths are...

• First, the single most important goal in communication must be *understanding* NOT *agreement!*


What difference does this make?
