The Preface to Heaven: The Second Coming of Christ

1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:5a Study Notes for March 17, 2013

I. Introduction

- A. Most recently in this series, we have been discussing "The Preface to Heaven" in which we have seen a variety of different things that will precede our entrance into the Final...
 - 1. Five Truths we Must Confess when it Comes to the End Times
 - 2. The Signs of the Times
 - a. Their Purpose, Mt. 16:1-4.
 - b. Their Identity, Mt. 24:4-14.
 - 3. The Intermediate State
- B. This morning we are going to turn our focus to the Second Coming of Christ from 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:5a. Consider the background of this passage...

II. The Preface to Heaven, Select.

- A. Five Truths we Must Confess when it Comes to the End Times
- B. The Signs of the Times
- C. The Intermediate State
- D. The Second Coming of Christ, 1 Thes. 4:15-17; 5:1-5a.
 - 1. The Second Coming of Christ will be Impartial, v. 15, 16b-17a.

*Point: Paul here is stressing the equality of the Second Coming of Christ. When Christ returns again, neither the dead nor the living will have an advantage! Both the dead and the living will be caught up "together" to meet their Lord! Christ's Second Coming will be Impartial!

2. The Second Coming of Christ will be Glorious, vv. 16-17a.

Paul's wording here is vivid. He places one powerful concept after another to convey the glorious nature of Christ's Second Coming. Notice...

With a Shout

With the Voice of the Archangel

With the Trumpet of God

The Dead in Christ Shall Rise First

The Living will be caught up together with them

All will meet the Lord in the Air

What Moses Requested from the Lord and what we get!...

*Point: Unlike with Moses, the Second Coming of Christ will not be accompanied with the beholding of shadows or clefts in rocks. Rather, at the Second Coming we will see the undiluted and unveiled glory of the Lord!

3. The Second Coming of Christ will bring Unbreakable Communion with Christ, v. 17b.

Our Original Creation, the consequence of the fall, and the partial restoration in this life...

A picture of the relationship we have with Christ today is given to us in Song of Solomon 5:2ff...

*Point: Is our relationship with God breakable in this age? Not in the sense of its being, but certainly in the sense of its wellbeing! Truly God is forever pursuing us as His children (and never does He forsake us). But it is we who break the communion and so miss the joy of His presence! Such is the relationship we have with God today. But notice that in the end this "in part relationship" will be in full, "…and thus we shall always be with the Lord."
