"You Must Be Born Again!"
Nic at Night
John 3:1-10
Reading: Colossians 2:6-15

Last Lord's Day we witnessed Jesus' *second* sign in John's Gospel (John 2):

Jesus *plaited* the whip and *purged* the temple. "Zeal for Your house will consume me!" (2:17)

Jesus *pushed back* on the Sanhedrin and *prophesied* His greatest sign: "*Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up.*" (2:19)

Jesus performed *more* signs during Passover and the crowds believed: *many* believed in His name, observing the signs He was doing (2:23).

But Jesus wasn't having any of it: "But Jesus, on His part, was not entrusting Himself to them, for He knew all men." (2:24)

## Let's pick up the account as we read 3:1-21

**One** man had been *taking it all in: multiple* miracles, *temple* purging, maybe even *John the Baptist's testimony*.

He was *pious* man and he had a *big spiritual* question: "How can I know I have eternal life?"

Jesus answered that man *enters* God's Kingdom by the *will* and *work* of the Holy Spirit.

We'll spend the next few weeks examining this life changing conversation, as...

One of the *most powerful teachers in Israel* poses three questions to the *most powerful teacher* in the world:

(This morning)

Ques.1 – How can I see the Kingdom of God? (vv.1-3)

Ques.2 – How can a man be born when he is old? (vv.4-8)

(Next Lord's Day)

Ques.3 – How can these things be? (vv.9-15)

The Final Answer – Believe in God's One & Only Son. (vv.16-21)

## Here's Nicodemus first question: "How can I see the Kingdom of God?" (vv1-3)

- 1. But who was Nicodemus (and who were the Pharisees)?
  - a. "Nicodemus" was a Greek name, but nonetheless it was popular among 1<sup>st</sup> century Jews: "Conqueror of the People."
  - b. We can assume from these first few verses that Nicodemus was an *older* man (4) and an *influential* man.
  - c. *Influential*, because after all, he was a *Pharisee*.... The *Pharisees* came on the *Jewish scene* sometime between the writing of the **OT** & **NT** ("*Intertestamental Period*" ~ **400** years).
    - i. They tended to be *middle-class* Jews, but more importantly, they tended to be *very strict* in their observance of the **OT** Law. In fact, they were usually *stricter* than the Law!
    - ii. And even though, in their pride, they often *looked down* on the *average Joe*, the *average Joe* tended to *look up* to the *pious Pharisees*.
  - d. But Nicodemus **wasn't** *just* a Pharisee do you see that phrase "a ruler of the Jews" (1b)?" That means Nicodemus was a member of the Jewish Sanhedrin.
    - i. The *Sanhedrin* ( = "70") was the *ruling council* in 1<sup>st</sup> century Israel, answering only to the occupying *Romans*.
    - ii. The council was comprised of *Pharisees* (theologically strict) and *Sadducees* (**not** so theologically strict). The Pharisees and the Sadducees *ruled* together, but they **didn't** always see eyeto-eye.
  - e. To cap it all off (10), Jesus labeled Nicodemus "the teacher in Israel." As in a noteworthy teacher. So, Pharisee & Ruler & Premier Teacher... Nicodemus was quite the man!

- 2. And one of Israel's *most prominent teachers* came to Jesus for *personal interview*.
  - a. He came at *night*. Maybe because the *aging ruler* from *Jerusalem* didn't want to be seen coming to the *young rabbi* from *Galilee*.
    - i. Or maybe it was just the *best time* to get together...
  - b. Whatever motivated the *time*, Nicodemus clearly came with *respect* (read v.2 *quote:* "Rabbi, we know...).
    - i. Our man Nicodemus was one of those *many* men & women who had witnessed Jesus' *Passover miracles* (beginning w/ the sign of the *Temple Purging*). **Remember v.23 (read)?**Nicodemus made it *clear*, those signs *impressed* him!
    - ii. And as member of the *Sanhedrin*, Nicodemus would have heard the report about John the Baptist's *testimony* (ch.1); especially what John has said about Jesus: "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!...this is the Son of God!"
    - iii. So as he came to Jesus, his *conclusion* was *unavoidable*: "we know you have come from God." (**OBTW**, did you catch that "we"...**not** just Nicodemus gets it, apparently there are others among the *Pharisees* and even in the *Sanhedrin* who get it!)
      - 1. "...no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with Him."
  - c. But despite witnessing the *signs* & the starting with this *respectful* greeting, Nicodemus beats around the bush!

- 3. Because here's what Nicodemus wanted to say! "How can I see the Kingdom of God?" **2X** 
  - a. What *huge topic* the "*Kingdom of God*"! The *biggest* explanation is the *simplest*: *God's rule over everything*! (After all, God *designed* & *created* & *sustains* everything!)
  - b. But Nicodemus has something a little more *specific* in mind, even if he's a little *tongue-tied*: "Seeing the Kingdom" = "citizenship in God's kingdom" which boils down to: "eternal life in the kingdom."
  - c. Nicodemus wants to know for sure he has eternal life....
- 4. Nicodemus beat around the bush, but Jesus cuts to the chase: read v.3.
  - a. "Verily verily..." All **three** of Jesus' answers (3, 5, 11) began like that. It was a formula that meant a crucial truth was on its way.
  - b. In fact, Jesus has just stated the *most important instruction* you & I will *ever hear*, on *either side of eternity*: "You **must** be born again!"
  - c. The Gr. word ανωθεν can be translated "again" or "from above."
  - d. You can translate Jesus' answer: "You must be born again."
    - i. As in, "Nicodemus, all your teacher & ruler & Pharisee accomplishments aren't enough to earn you eternal life!"
    - ii. "Again...." As in, Nicodemus; you're going to have to start all over, on an entirely new footing! Spirit... and not good works.
  - e. *Whoa*! ?Being a Pharisees (etc.) *wasn't enough*!?! How do you suppose an *aging leader* who had invested his *long life* in earning *God's favor* by *keeping the Ten Commandments* (etc.) felt about that...?
    - i. Bible scholar **R.C.H Lenski** has this insight: Son of Abraham, Jew, Sadducee, famous teacher...now it all means **nothing!?!**Jesus is telling Nicodemus that the work of a long, strict lifetime has just been reduced to a **pile of ashes!**

- 5. Beloved, I hope you care about eternal life (I can assure you, I do!)!
  - a. And I hope you see that if an *uber-religious* guy like Nicodemus has to *start over* at the most fundamental spiritual level (you know *born again*)...
  - b. ...then **you can't** do enough *good/religious* things to **earn** *eternal life!*

Friend, Jesus doesn't command you to improve your life, you have to start all over: "You must be born again!"

## That got Nicodemus' attention, and it provoked his second question: "How can a man be born when he is old? (Read just v.4.)

- 1. Nicodemus is *stunned*. In fact **v.7**, Jesus *admonishes* him for his *amazement*.
  - a. Womb & birth...? Coming out the first time was tough enough, going back in and coming back a second time sounds inconceivable!
  - b. Now, perhaps Nicodemus **is** *completely confused*... and he thinks this *really* is some kind of an **OB/GYN** conversation.
  - c. Or maybe "the teacher of Israel" understands that Jesus is moving on spiritual ground, and Nicodemus is able to keep the same illustration.
  - d. But either way, our friend is *shocked* and *out of his league*. "I've poured my life into the Law (traditional religion); how can I start over again?"
- 2. Jesus' answer pounds home that *eternal life* (v.5 *entering the kingdom of God*) is an *act of God's Spirit*. **Read vv.5-7.** 
  - a. Some people think Jesus is referring to **two** births in v.6: *natural* birth ("of water") followed by spiritual birth. Or perhaps of water baptism accompanied by spiritual birth.
    - i. But **neither** is correct. Both the **OT** & **NT equate** "born of water and the Spirit" with one thing: spiritual rebirth.
    - ii. Ezek 36:25-27 Then I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean; I will cleanse you from all your filthiness and from all your idols. <sup>26</sup> Moreover, I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; and I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. <sup>27</sup> I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will be careful to observe My ordinances.
      - 1. This New Covenant promise equates our *new spiritual life* with *sprinkling*, *cleansing*, *new heart*, *new spirit*, *new faithfulness*, and the indwelling of God's *Holy Spirit*.
      - **2.** It all *boils down* to **one** thing: receiving spiritual life i.e. receiving eternal life.

- b. Then Jesus answers Nicodemus' **second** *question* by repeating the *most important instruction of all time!* "You must be born again!"
  - i. Here is a spiritual *fact of life* you **must** *not* **miss** (6): *everyone* has human birth but **not** *everyone* has spiritual birth.
  - ii. The *spiritual birth* is necessary or you remain just *flesh*. And that's *not good*...
  - iii. You need a *spiritual birth* and that's a work of the *Holy Spirit*.
- c. Friend, may I say it **one** more time? "Don't be shocked! You must be born again."
- 3. From the *breeze* on your face, to the *prairie wind* that turns those giant wind turbines, to the *hurricane storms* that batter coastlines, you **can't** *see it* but you **can't** *deny it*!
  - a. Jesus says the *wind* is a real-life picture of how **God's** *spirit* regenerates **man's** *spirit*. (Don't forget, man's spirit is *dead* until the Holy Spirit *stirs*! **Eph 2:1** *And you were dead in your* ...)
  - b. Interestingly, in both the Greek & the Hebrew languages, the same words translate *wind* & *spirit*: in Hebrew it's *ruach*, and in Greek it's *pneuma* (pneumatic tool).
  - c. Who can map where the *blowing wind* and *spiritual rebirth* begin and end; both are *invisible* ... but **not** their effects.
    - i. The wind is real and so is the Spirit.
  - d. You can be sure the wind does *whatever it wants*, **un**influenced by *man*, even by the man it *touches*.
    - i. And God's Spirit is **not** subject to human *will* or *control*.
    - ii. The Holy Spirit works like the *wind* in the lives of the people to whom it gives *spiritual life*.

Do you want eternal life? God's Spirit has to touch you & give you, life everlasting.

## I hope that at some time in your life, you've asked Jesus the "Nicodemus question": "How can I have eternal life?"

Jesus' answer is *still the same*:

- 1. You must be born again! That's because you're dead... Your sin is the symptom of your spiritual death. You do sin (deed, word, thought, motive), you are a sinner (by nature), and so you are dead in your trespasses and sins.
- 2. The **NT** tersely diagnoses you this way: "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God," because "you were dead in your transgressions."

God judges sinners. That's bad news!

- 1. God is mankind's *Creator* and *King*, and your sin marks you as a *rebel*.
- 2. When the rebel stands before the King, he'll be *judged* and *condemned*.
- 3. It is appointed for men to die once, and after death comes judgement.
- 4. Holy God's condemnation of *sinners* is *real* and *just*: it is *eternal* and *excruciatingly awful*.
- 5. And God will allow only **one** of *two* people to *pay* for your sin.
- 6. You or Jesus. You don't want it to be you...

So God's sent His *one & only* Son to pay *for* you sins *in* your place.

- 1. As we've already seen in the *Gospel of John*, Jesus *existed* from all *eternity* as God's Son. Then at *just the right* time in history Jesus was born as the *miraculously conceived child* of Mary. Which means Jesus is *truly God* and *truly Man*. That combination of *deity* and *humanity* makes Jesus *uniquely qualified* to *pay* for our sins.
- 2. That is what happened on the *cross*: *all* of the sins of *all* of Christ's people for *all* time were placed on Jesus, and God *punished* Him there for us!
- 3. The New Testament says: But God demonstrates His own love for us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

- 4. To *prove to the world* that God *accepts* Jesus' payment, He *raised* Christ from the grave on the **third** day (*Resurrection*).
- 5. The Resurrection *also* proves that *eternal life* is God's gift to children; He *raised* Christ, He'll *raise* you! (*That's* what *Nicodemus was looking for!*)

But how - how can you know that Jesus' payment, pays for your sins? Here's how:

- 1. *Look* to Christ, and Christ *alone*. The Bible teaches that the only *condition* for receiving God's forgiveness is *faith* and *repentance*.
- 2. **Repent** (turn) by turning away from your sins and selfishness and turn to Jesus.
- 3. *Trust* that Jesus *is* who He claims (The Son of God) and has *done* what He claims (*died* to pay for all your sins, *resurrected* on the  $3^{rd}$  day).
- 4. If you look to Jesus, God will forgive you and give you spiritual life!

Are you born again...?

I'll say it once more: "You must be born again!"
