 - 2. The Lord's Hatred Of Wickedness Has Always Motivated Him To Redeem A People For His Own Possession, (14)
 - **14.1)** The Lord's Decree To Destroy The Wicked Is A Very Real Thing "Let Me Alone (Impv) / May Destroy""Thus says the LORD concerning this people: "They have loved to wander thus; they have not restrained their feet; therefore the LORD does not accept them; now he will remember their iniquity and punish their sins." The LORD said to me: "Do not pray for the welfare of this people. Though they fast, I will not hear their cry, and though they offer burnt offering and grain offering, I will not accept them. But I will consume them by the sword, by famine, and by pestilence."" (Jeremiah 14:10–12, ESV)

14.2) The Lord's Decree To Destroy The Wicked Is A Very Absolute Thing"Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear." But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood..." - **14.3)** The Lord's Decree To Purify A People Is A Very Certain Thing

 "Make A Nation Mightier"
 "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." (1 Peter 2:9–10, ESV)
- 1) "Remember, then, what you received and heard. Keep it, and repent. 2) If you will not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come against you. 3) Yet you have still a few names in Sardis, people who have not soiled their garments, and they will walk with me in white, for they are worthy.4) The one who conquers will be clothed thus in white garments, and I will never blot his name out of the book of life. 5) I will confess his name before my Father and before his angels. 6) He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.'"
