Jesus teaches us to pray—Part 9/final

As a child of our heavenly Father, we conclude our prayer to Him with praise.

We see:

1. We praise God that He is willing and able to give us all that is good.
2. We praise God for the assurance that He hears us and He answers our prayers.
3. We praise God by declaring that He alone should receive all glory.

The Heidelberg Catechism

117. Q. What belongs to a prayer which pleases God and is heard by Him?

A. First, we must from the heart call upon the one true God only, who has revealed Himself in His Word, for all that He has commanded us to pray.[1] Second, we must thoroughly know our need and misery, so that we may humble ourselves before God.[2] Third, we must rest on this firm foundation that, although we do not deserve it, God will certainly hear our prayer for the sake of Christ our Lord, as He has promised us in His Word.[3]

128. Q. How do you **conclude** your prayer?

A. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. That is: All this we ask of Thee because, as our King, having power over all things, Thou art both willing and able to give us all that is good,[1] and because not we but Thy holy Name should so receive all glory forever.[2]

129. Q. What does the word **Amen** mean?

A. **Amen** means: It is true and certain. For God has much more certainly heard my prayer than I feel in my heart that I desire this of Him.[1]

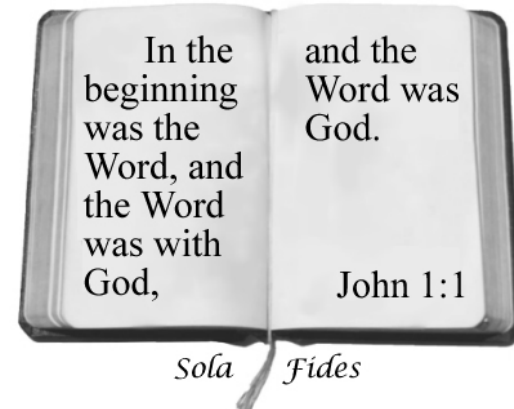
