- B. Prayer should be God-centered. 11:2 Mt. 6:9-10

- C. Pray for what you need. v. 3 Mt. 6:11-13

III. Jesus encourages you to pray. v. 5-13

- A. God will hear your persistent prayers. v. 5-8
 - 1. A very awkward situation arises when a late-night guest arrives. v. 5 10:38ff
 - 2. Can you imagine that a friend would refuse to help you? v. 5b-7
 - 3. A friend will give you the bread regardless of his motives. v. 8
 - 4. What comparison is intended between God and the man who finally lends the bread? Ps. 121:4 34:15
 - 5. If a reluctant neighbor will finally help after much imploring, how much more will your loving Father hear your persistent prayers.
- B. Keep on asking, seeking and knocking. v. 9-10
 - 1. Why ask if God has already promised to provide for us? Mt. 6:25ff Js. 4:2b
 - 2. Fervently seek until you find and knock until it is opened. Jer. 29:13 Mt. 6:33
 - 3. God is a Friend Who is willing to answer.
 - 4. He is the Giver of every good gift. Js. 1:17
 - 5. What, in the context, does Jesus expect us to be asking and seeking? $\underline{11:2-4}$ Mt. 6:33
 - 6. Why do we so often fail to persist in prayer?

- C. God is a good Father Who gives His children good things. v. 11-13 Ps. 84:11 34:9f
 - 1. Yet again Jesus argues from the lesser to the greater.
 - 2. Even sinful human fathers give their children the good things they need.
 - 3. How much more will God, Who is the perfect Father, give us all we need. 15:20ff Ps. 103:13f <u>Isa. 49:15</u>
- D. Many people misunderstand these promises.
 - 1. God is not your prayer genie. Acts 19:11-17
 - 2. Jesus does not promise lifelong material wealth and physical health. Js. 1:2ff
 - 3. The context clarifies Jesus' meaning.
 - 4. Proper prayer puts God's will ahead of our will. 11:2c 10:40-42 <u>22:42</u> Mt. 6:10b Rom. 11:33ff 2 Co. 12:7-9 1 Jo. 5:14
 - 5. Sometimes He tells us "no". 10:40-42 22:42 2 Co. 12:7-9
 - 6. Sometimes we may ask for a snake or a scorpion.
 - 7. God knows best what you need. Ps. 119:67,71 Js. 1:2ff
- E. Why are our prayers sometimes answered, "no"?
 - 1. Jesus' promise is only for God's children. Mt. 12:38-39 Pr. 15:29 Luke 13:24-30
 - 2. Your sin may hinder your prayers. Isa. 59:2 1 Pe. 3:7 Pr. 28:9 1 Jo. 3:22 Ps. 66:18
 - 3. You may be asking with wrong motives. Js. 4:3 Acts 8:22 Mt. 6:24
 - 4. What you want may not be according to God's sovereign will. 1 Jo. 5:14-15
 - 5. He may have a good purpose which you cannot yet understand. 2 Co. 12:7-10
 - 6. His timing is perfect. 1:13 1 Sam. 1:27
 - 7. Sometimes we may be perplexed by God's answers.
- F. For what are you praying? v. 13b
 - 1. We should be asking for what matters most. 10:42,27a 11:2-3 Mt. 6:33
 - 2. We get in trouble when we desire anything more than we seek after God. Js. 4:1-7
 - 3. What we need most is the Holy Spirit. v. 13b 24:49 Acts 1:5,8 Gal. 5:16ff Eph. 3:21ff John 14-16

- 8. Why are some prayers answered "no" or "wait"? Does this contradict Jesus' promise?
- 9. How would you answer someone who says that we can expect God to make us rich and healthy based upon verses 9-10?
- 10. What is the point of Jesus' example of earthly fathers giving their sons fish and eggs?
- 11. What does it mean to ask for and seek the Holy Spirit?
- 12. How has God answered your prayers? Whom should you tell?
