How Hope is Secured Ezra 10:5-44

Ezra 10:5-44 continues the story of hope which was declared in the first five verses where Schechaniah declares, "yet now there is hope in Israel in spite of this." However in verses 5-44, it is revealed *how* the hope of repentance was secured. It is one thing to acknowledge your sin, but its another thing to follow through with necessary changes.

- I. Hope is declared, v1-4
 - 1. A very large assembly gathers in sorrow, V1-4 Hope is declared
- II. Hope is secured v5-44
 - 1. Ezra makes them swear an oath, V5 there must be clearly defined direction
 - 2. Ezra enters a room and fasts, v6 there must be help from heaven
 - 3. They issue a proclamation choose Put away or be separated, v7-8 there must be urgency of action
 - 4. Trembling and Confrontation v9-11 the sins must be named
 - 5. Careful inspection and action is requested wisdom is necessary, v12-17
 - 6. The repenters are identified, 18-44 sacrifice must be made
