The Burnt Offering, Part 2 Leviticus 6:8-13

Main Point:

Take comfort from God's constant presence, be forgiven by God's constant grace, and give praise per God's constant desire.

- 1. The fire was never to go out on the altar of burnt offering.
- 2. Because God's presence is always with His people.
- 3. Because God's grace is always available to His people.
- 4. Because God's worship is always welcomed from His people.
- 5. This is all due to the love of God for you and the work of your Holy Priest.
- 6. Therefore, take comfort from God, be forgiven by God, and give praise to God.

Allan Moseley "What's worse than reading minute, gory details about sacrifices that are not offered anymore. Reading those minute, gory details twice! Reading Leviticus 6:8-7:38 is a bit like that."

John Currid "The same sacrifices are discussed as in Leviticus 1-5, but now from the perspective of the priests. Leviticus 6:8-7:38 appears to be a priestly manual for the operation of the sacrificial system in Israel."

Leviticus 9:23-24 23 And Moses and Aaron went into the tabernacle of meeting, and came out and blessed the people. Then the glory of the LORD appeared to all the people, 24 And fire came out from before the LORD and consumed the burnt offering and the fat on the altar. When all the people saw *it*, they shouted and fell on their faces. (NKJV)

Leviticus 1:4 4 Then he shall put his hand on the head of the burnt offering, and it will be accepted on his behalf to make atonement for him. (NKJV)

Allan Moseley "The fire was always burning, so atonement was always obtainable. God was letting His people know that His atonement and forgiveness of sin were always available."

1 Chronicles 16:29 29 Give to the LORD the glory *due* His name; Bring an offering, and come before Him. Oh, worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness! (NKJV)

Exodus 28:43 43 They shall be on Aaron and on his sons when they come into the tabernacle of meeting, or when they come near the altar to minister in the holy *place*, that they do not incur iniquity and die ... (NKJV)

John Currid "Holy garments are to be worn in the work of the sanctuary."

Isaiah 43:1-2 1 But now, thus says the LORD, who created you, O Jacob, And He who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called *you* by your name; You *are* Mine. 2 When you pass through the waters, I *will* be with you; And through the rivers, they shall not overflow you. When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, Nor shall the flame scorch you. (NKJV)

Hebrews 7:25 25 Therefore He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them. (NKJV)

Hebrews 13:15 15 Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of *our* lips, giving thanks to His name. (NKJV)
