Colossians 2:16-23

Introduction: We come to the part of the book of Colossians where the Apostle Paul addresses religious issues facing the believers at Colossae. These issues were man-made, not God made. These issues took the attention of the believers at Colossae away from Christ and became an obstacle between the believers and Christ in their relationship to Him. Paul has reminded the believers at Colossae that Christ has destroyed the power of the enemy by means of the Cross. Therefore he addresses their need of putting their focus back on Christ and not on the "religious practices" of mankind.
