"... but that He Loved Us and Sent His Son ...

Introduction: Things act like their nature

- I. God's Nature
 - a. "Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love." 1 Jn 4:8
 - b. "So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love . . . " 1 Jn. 4: 16
 - c. One attribute of God that gets no pushback is that God is love.
 - d. This statement presupposes the entirety of the Biblical sweep of revelation about Almighty God.
 - i. For instance:
 - e. It is entirely inappropriate to see this characterization of God as nullifying His justice and Holy Righteousness.
 - f. It is not possible to argue that a God who is love cannot also be a God who condemns and punishes the disobedient
 - i. "In this is love, not that we have loved God, but that He loved us and sent His so as a propitiation for our sins." 1 John 4: 10
 - 1. Propitiation is from a Latin word meaning to appease. The use of the word presupposes that God hates sin and that his disposition towards sin is wrath.
 - 2. He, Himself, absorbed the loss and gave Himself over to wrath for our benefit
 - 3. "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only son."
 - 4. God Himself covered our sin debt at the price of the suffering and death of His own dear son.
 - g. What is it to say that God is love?
 - i. God's love is an exercise of His goodness:
 - 1. Louis Berkhof "Goodness is that perfection in God which prompts Him to deal bountifully and Kindly with all His creatures."
 - 2. "He who did not spare His own son, but delivered Him up for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things."
 - a. Rom 8:32
 - 3. Goodness elicits the best in others as does love (1 Cor 13: 4)
 - ii. God's love is an exercise of His goodness toward individual sinners
 - God had you in mind when He went to the cross He did not die for mankind monolithically – for a nameless, faceless humanity – but for you personally and particularly – His love was specific
 - 2. "But we ought always to give thanks to God for you brothers, beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the first fruits to be saved."

II. Take Away

- a. Everything acts according to its nature
- b. We act according to our new nature
 - <u>2 Corinthians 5: 17</u> Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.
- Believe the bad news/good news
- Love in increasing measure
