



## "The Jailer and His Household"

Acts 16: 25 - 40

<sup>25</sup>But about midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns of praise to God, and the prisoners were listening to them; <sup>26</sup> and suddenly there came a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison house were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. <sup>27</sup> When the jailer awoke and saw the prison doors opened, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, supposing that the prisoners had escaped. <sup>28</sup> But Paul cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here!" <sup>29</sup> And he called for lights and rushed in, and trembling with fear he fell down before Paul and Silas, <sup>30</sup> and after he brought them out, he said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

<sup>31</sup> They said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." <sup>32</sup> And they spoke the word of the Lord to him together with all who were in his house. <sup>33</sup> And he took them that *very* hour of the night and washed their wounds, and immediately he was baptized, he and all his *household*. <sup>34</sup> And he brought them into his house and set food before them, and rejoiced greatly, having believed in God with his whole household.

"Release those men." <sup>36</sup> And the jailer reported these words to Paul, *saying*, "The chief magistrates have sent to release you. Therefore come out now and go in peace." <sup>37</sup> But Paul said to them, "They have beaten us in public without trial, men who are Romans, and have thrown us into prison; and now are they sending us away secretly? No indeed! But let them come themselves and bring us out." <sup>38</sup> The policemen reported these words to the chief magistrates. They were afraid when they heard that they were Romans, <sup>39</sup> and they came and appealed to them, and when they had brought them out, they kept begging them to leave the city. <sup>40</sup> They went out of the prison and entered *the house of* Lydia, and when they saw the brethren, they encouraged them and departed.

# Easter Offering Recipient

Galmi Hospital, in Niger, will be the recipient of our Easter sacrificial offering this year. Matt and Tara Megill, missionaries supported by us, are serving in Niger. Matt is the director of HIV & TB Programs and when asked about their needs, turned the focus to the hospital itself.

Galmi Hospital was built in 1950, outside the town of Galmi in south central Niger. The hospital began with one doctor but quickly expanded to a 56-bed facility. Today the hospital has 180 beds, three operating theatres, an HIV clinic, malnutrition center and an outpatient program that handles over 250 cases per day. Most of the doctors are missionaries but the nursing and medical support roles are covered by Nigeriens. This site will continue to be needed as a hospital for many years to come. Niger is one of the poorest and least developed countries in the world. According to the 2020 UN Human Development Index, Niger ranks 189th out of 189 countries. Many of the existing health facilities are cost prohibitive for the average Nigerien.

Galmi Hospital is often the only hospital that people can afford to use. Although government-run hospitals are subsidized for the care they provide, patients incur the cost of all medicines and/or materials. These must be purchased at private pharmacies which are beyond the means of the majority of Nigeriens. Galmi Hospital provides a comprehensive care for set fees that are within reason. Galmi Hospital also provides free care through our benevolent fund to people who would be rejected from government care, despite the severity of their condition due to their inability to pay. Galmi Hospital draws patients from across Niger. In this largely Muslim nation, only 0.3% of the population is Christian, and so this hospital with its evangelists and Christian proclamation represents a strategic

Gospel center for the nation. Every patient who visits the outpatient department will have the opportunity to hear the Gospel by means of the Jesus Film in the waiting room as well as their interaction with Christian doctors who are encouraged to take time with patients to share their faith and pray with them.

The ministry goals and vision for this project is to redevelop hospital facilities for the provision of high-quality medical care and to manage the redevelopment in ways that will not interrupt the provision of services. Also, the goal is to continue to shine the light of Jesus Christ in Niger through the provision of high-quality medical care.

The project has been ongoing, but there is still work to do on the construction of a new medical ward. Please pray about your part in this special opportunity to be a light in the land of Niger. All of our gifts will be an encouragement to Matt and the other doctors and medical staff serving there.

CONCLUSION: The jailer had just been following orders, even though they were vile and unjust orders; it wasn't his fault. Then an earthquake struck and he would be blamed for the prisoners' escape. But something totally unexpected happened. He heard the Word of the Lord and found deliverance for himself and his family. Then at his kitchen table, sometime past midnight, the grace and mercy of Jesus were on full display. The King took this family as His own and through them ministered to others. Come and praise the Lord God Almighty!

## Acts 2:38-41

And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself." And with many other words he bore witness and continued to exhort them, saying, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation." So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

## Acts 11: 12 – 14

And the Spirit told me to go with them, making no distinction. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. And he told us how he had seen the angel stand in his house and say, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon who is called Peter; he will declare to you a message by which you will be saved, you and all your household.'

## Acts 28: 28 – 31

Therefore let it be known to you that *this salvation* of God has been sent to the Gentiles; they will listen." He lived there two whole years at his own expense, and welcomed all who came to him, proclaiming the kingdom of God and teaching about the *Lord Jesus Christ* with all boldness and without hindrance.

## Philippians 2: 9 - 11

Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that **Jesus Christ is Lord**, to the glory of God the Father.

## Second Corinthians 4: 5 - 12

For what we proclaim is not ourselves, but *Jesus Christ as Lord*, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you.

## **Taking Gathered Worship Home**

We are introduced to this Philippian Jailer without a name. He simply follows orders. He puts Paul & Silas in the inner cell with their bloody backs unwashed and their feet locked in stocks. Yet when God supernaturally unlocks the unjust bonds of our missionary friends, it is not to free them, but to rescue the Jailer and his family.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

### **Sunday Morning**

READ Acts 16:25-40; 2Corinthians 4:5-12; Philippians 2:9-11. DISCUSS, What does it mean that Jesus is the Lord? Have you confessed that He is? Have you submitted yourself to His rule and reign over all of your life? PRAY "Jesus, You are Lord of all. Please help us to submit to You in every aspect of our lives, individually, in our families, and together as a congregation at FCCW."

### **Sunday Evening**

### Monday

READ Acts 16:25-40; 2Corinthians 4:5-12.; DISCUSS, What specifically about Jesus should we be proclaiming? Why? For our own sake? How can we do this when we are so weak? MEDITATE on Romans 10:9. PRAY, "Lord, You give us the incredible privilege of telling others about Your Kingdom. Embolden us to do so."

## Tuesday

READ Acts 10:2; 11:12-14; 16:15; 31-34; 18:8. DISCUSS, Compare and contrast these four households. What is their initial position regarding the God of the Bible? Where are they officially identified? What happens? What is their reaction? Whose reaction is specifically mentioned in each? MEDITATE on Romans 10:9. PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for drawing us to believe that You are Lord of all. Thank You for Your work in and through our families/households."

### Wednesday

READ Acts 2:38-41; 11:12-14; 16:31-34; 28:28-31. DISCUSS, For whom is the promise of salvation given? Why? What should we do if we believe Jesus is the Lord? *How are we identified as part of His people?* MEDITATE on Romans 10:9. PRAY, "Jesus, thank You for your promised deliverance from evil. Work in and through our families we pray."

### **Thursday**

READ Acts 16:25-40; Philippians 2:9-11. DISCUSS, What does it mean to confess Jesus as Lord? How does this address our identity as rebels against God? How does God change the Jailer's loyalties? What does that mean for his family? MEDITATE on Romans 10:9. PRAY, "Lord, enable us to walk in Your ways. Guide us in Your truth."

### Friday

READ Acts 16:25-40; 2Corinthians 4:5-12; Philippians 2:9-11. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? MEDITATE on Romans 10:9. PRAY for faithfulness at FCCW and revival throughout the area.

### Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. *Both live-stream & in- person services are available*.

READ **Luke 16:1-17**; **Malachi 3:6-12**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for either the *live-stream or in-person service*. Ask Jesus to help us love our neighbors well.
