3. The sermon claimed that Psalm 24 is largely designed to point out our sin and point us to our need for a redeemer. Why did the sermon claim this? Is this simply a nice idea or are there actually reasons for believing this within Psalm 24 itself? _____

4. About whom is Psalm 24 ultimately speaking (consider especially verses 7-10)? Who is the only Man who perfectly fulfilled the virtues described in this Psalm and is therefore worthy to stand before God (cf. Romans 5:19)? _____

5. The sermon contended that once a person is forgiven and justified by Jesus, he or she is then enabled by God’s Spirit to approximate the portrait painted in Psalm 24. What does this mean? Does this contradict the claim made in question 3 above? Why or why not? _____

6. Psalm 24 is made up of 3 distinct parts. Identify these parts, give them each a title, and explain how they connect to one another. _____

7. Imagine how Psalm 24 would speak to the following people: the proud Pharisee (cf. Galatians 3:10); the thief on the cross (cf. Romans 6:23); the mature disciple (cf. Galatians 5:13). How would this same passage speak in different ways to different people? _____
