# The Unfaithful City and The Faithful God

#### Isaiah 1:21-31

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#### Intro -

Augustine's great work "The City of God" was written to contrast the People of God from the people of the world.

The City of God = God's People

The City of the world = The People of the World

In this passage the prophet states that the City of God, Jerusalem, had become the world.

## 1 - A Fatal Change - verses 21-23

Isa 1:21 How is the faithful city become an harlot! it was full of judgment; righteousness lodged in it; but now murderers.

Isa 1:22 Thy silver is become dross, thy wine mixed with water:

Isa 1:23 Thy princes are rebellious, and companions of thieves: every one loveth gifts, and followeth after rewards: they judge not the fatherless, neither doth the cause of the widow come unto them.

#### Note - The Four Contrasts in verses 21-22

#### How is the faithful city become an harlot!

Imagine for a moment, in a literal sense, this image in an actual person.

it was full of judgment; righteousness lodged in it; but now murderers.

Matthew Poole - that horrid crime of murder is noted, to assure us that Other crimes of a lower nature were not only unpunished, but even encouraged.

#### Thy silver is become dross,

Young - The thought is not that here and there specks appear upon the metal but that the metal itself has turned into dross.

## thy wine mixed with water:

Young - so much water had been added that its unique character had been lost.

## Note - Six damning Indictments against the Rulers - verse 23

**Thy princes are -** (Who they are - what they should be)

# 1 - What they actually are - in reality and fact rebellious,

It is dreadful when the Rulers become the Rebels. (as the sin of witchcraft)

#### 2 - Who they associate with

## companions of thieves:

App - Who do you like to spend time with? (Psalm 1)

## 3 - What they love

every one loveth gifts,

Rather than being lovers of God, they were lovers of things!

#### 4 - What they follow (Not the Lord)

#### and followeth after rewards:

What should they have been pursuing? Psa 34:14 Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it.

Illus - Des Smyth - if Ten million euro was on a roof, what would you do to get it?

How unlike God they had become -

Deu 10:17 For the LORD your God is God of gods, and Lord of lords, a great God, a mighty, and a terrible, which regardeth not persons, nor taketh reward:

Deu 10:18 He doth execute the judgment of the fatherless and widow, and loveth the stranger, in giving him food and raiment.

Consequently - (because they are so unlike God)

they judge not the fatherless,

neither doth the cause of the widow come unto them.

#### 2 - A Faithful God - verses 24-27

Isa 1:24 Therefore saith the Lord, the LORD of hosts, the mighty One of Israel, Ah, I will ease me of mine adversaries, and avenge me of mine enemies:

Isa 1:25 And I will turn my hand upon thee, and purely purge away thy dross, and take away all thy tin:

Isa 1:26 And I will restore thy judges as at the first, and thy counsellors as at the beginning: afterward thou shalt be called, The city of righteousness, the faithful city.

Isa 1:27 Zion shall be redeemed with judgment, and her converts with righteousness.

Note - He is Faithful

#### 1 - Because of Who He is

Therefore saith the Lord, the LORD of hosts, the mighty One of Israel,

Consider - Here we have a Triple designation of who God is.

He is Adon - Sovereign Ruler He is Jehovah of hosts - covenant name - self existent one The Mighty one of Israel - Israel's champion.

Young - The heaping together of names lends a tremendous force to the announcement.

#### 2 - He is Faithful in Judgment

Ah, I will ease me of mine adversaries, and avenge me of mine enemies:

Consider - The personal nature of these descriptions

App - On the day of judgment it will be personal between God and his enemies. (in contrast - The judge who condemned 16 year old - not personal but official)

Young - The sinner, and not merely the sin, is like a wearisome burden to God,

# 3 - He is Faithful in Preservation

Isa 1:25 And I will turn my hand upon thee, and purely purge away thy dross, and take away all thy tin:

Isa 1:26 And I will restore thy judges as at the first, and thy counsellors as at the beginning: afterward thou shalt be called, The city of righteousness, the faithful city.

Note - God's purpose is not total and utter destruction, but purification.

He is Personal in his dealings **And I will turn my hand upon thee** whereas, they had become distant from their God - He would not be distant.

Also - It will be a total work! - and purely purge away thy dross, and take away all thy tin:

It will be a Reforming Work - And I will restore thy judges as at the first, and thy counsellors as at the beginning:

(See Ezra and Nehemiah)

It will be a Recognised Work - afterward thou shalt be called, The city of righteousness, the faithful city.

App - Do others notice God's Work in your Soul?

# 4 - He is Faithful in the Means of his Promises of Redemption.

Isa 1:27 Zion shall be redeemed with judgment, and her converts with righteousness.

Note - Redemption is always by the same means!

Man Rebels by Waywardness and Sin.

God Redeems by Judgment and Righteousness!

Consider - The Cross of Christ is the supreme revelation of this truth.

## 3 - A Fearful Judgment - verses 28-31

Isa 1:28 And the destruction of the transgressors and of the sinners shall be together, and they that forsake the LORD shall be consumed.

Isa 1:29 For they shall be ashamed of the oaks which ye have desired, and ye shall be confounded for the gardens that ye have chosen.

Isa 1:30 For ye shall be as an oak whose leaf fadeth, and as a garden that hath no water.

Isa 1:31 And the strong shall be as tow, and the maker of it as a spark, and they shall both burn together, and none shall quench them.

- 1 A Collective Judgment
- 2 A Consuming Judgment
- 3 A Confounding Judgment

Then is verses 30-31 the Collective, Consuming and Confounding Judgment is described -

By these illustrations -

For ye shall be as an oak whose leaf fadeth, and as a garden that hath no water.

And the strong shall be as tow, (tinder - that which is used at the start) and the maker of it as a spark,

and they shall both burn together, and none shall quench them.

(illus - what happens when you mix a firelighter with a lighted match?)

App - This is what we are by nature without Christ. How we need him!!!

Do you feel your need for Christ?

Only he can guench the power and penalty of sin.
