Sermon: Explaining Why Our Torah Is Weird! “The Faithful Outcasts” Pt.12

I Text:

Old Covenant: *Isaiah 9:1-7*

New Covenant: *Hebrews 4:14-16*

II Doctrine:

In the first century A.D. the first group of “Christian” outcasts were exhorted to occupy until the Lord comes. These people of the “way” would have to profess why their “Torah” living was different than other Hebrews. Christians must give witness and explain why we live the way we do. Our basic moral practices are now seen as weird to a lawless generation.

The Messiah defeated Satan himself in a one on one showdown. The greatest duel in the history of creation occurred in the first century. Movies and cinema play homage to this event today with the showdown between the hero and villain. The hero is usually victorious and defeats a villain no one else could.
