Super Abundance in the Lord

- 1. Boaz Showers Ruth with Growing Favor.
 - A. Boaz Blesses Ruth with Favor at Meal Time (14).
 - B. Ruth Takes a "Higher" Seat at Boaz's Invitation (14b).
 - C. Boaz Instructs His Men to Favor Ruth (15-16).
 - D. Ruth Ends the Day with a Super Abundance (17).
- 2. God Provides This Abundance for Ruth through Boaz.

3. He Continues to Provide Us with Great Abundance.

Conclusion: This part of the story shows us a piling on of abundant favor. Boaz is making it clear that Ruth is to be afforded every honor and courtesy by all those in his employ. Boaz in turn is in the service of the God of Israel and here is His agent for blessing Ruth and Naomi. How does this picture of Divine favor help us to understand Christ's blessings to us?

Ephesians 3:14-21

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, ¹⁵ from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, ¹⁶ that *according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being*, ¹⁷ so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to *know the love of Christ* that surpasses knowledge, *that you may be filled with all the fullness of God*.

²⁰Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, ²¹ to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

Luke 14:7-11

Now Jesus told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honor, saying to them, ⁸ "When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do *not* sit down in a *place of honor*, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, ⁹ and he who invited you both will come and say to you, 'Give your place to this person,' and then you will begin with shame to take the lowest place. ¹⁰ But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher.' Then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at table with you. ¹¹ For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."
