- B. Our love for God comes next. Rom. 12:1b-2 Mt. 22:36-38
- C. Finally, our love for one another flows out of God's love for us. I Jo. 4:11,19

II. Love is sincere. v. 9a II Co. 6:6

- A. Why does Paul begin his moral exhortations with love? I Th. 4:9 I Pe. 1:22 He. 13:1
 - 1. Love is the summary of God's law. 13:8 Mark 12:28-34
 - 2. Love is the central demand of the New Covenant. John 13:34-35
 - 3. Love is the first and greatest of Christian virtues. I Co. 13:13 Gal. 5:22
- B. While we all favor love, love is not easy.
 - 1. We are by nature selfish. Mt. 22:39 Phil. 2:1-4 II Tim. 3:2
 - 2. Some people (even in the church community) are very hard to love.
- C. In what ways can love be tainted by hypocrisy?
 - 1. Love which playacts.
 - 2. Feigned love which hides hatred. Luke 22:48 Ps. 55:21
 - 3. Insincere love which has ulterior motives.
 - 4. Mistaking feelings of passion or infatuation for love.
- D. Instead, love must be genuine. <u>I Co. 13:4-6</u> <u>I John 4:7-11</u> 3:18
 - 1. We are to love others as God has loved us. I Jo. 4:11
 - 2. Biblical love is not limited by the merit or the performance of the beloved.
 - 3. Biblical love is more than a feeling. It is defined by commitment and action.
 - 4. Is it insincere to do the right thing, even if you don't feel like it?
 - 5. Must you first love yourself? II Ti. 3:2 Mt. 22:39

III. Love is discerning. v. 9b

- A. True love hates (what is evil). I Th. 5:22
 - 1. Love is not mere mushy sentiment.
 - 2. God, Who is Love, hates wickedness. <u>Prov. 6:16-19</u> Ps. 101:4 <u>Co. 3:5-6</u> Is. 1:12ff Amos 5:21 Heb. 1:9 John 2:13ff
 - 3. If you love God, you will hate what God hates. <u>Prov. 8:13 Ps. 97:10</u> Amos 5:15 Eph. 5:3-4 <u>Jude 1:23</u> Ga. 5:19-21
 - 4. If you love others, you will want God's best for them. I Co. 13:6,5a Heb. 13:4
- B. True love clings to what is good. Phil. 4:8-9 I Co. 13:6 I Th. 5:21 Ps. 1:1ff
 - 1. When you have a renewed mind, you have a new idea of what is good. 12:2
 - 2. You love what God loves. Ps. 1:2 Ga. 5:22f
 - 3. True love seeks to enhance what is good for the beloved. Eph. 5:25-27
- C. Are you helping one another to avoid evil and seek good?

IV. Love cares deeply. v. 10a

- A. Be devoted to one another in the family of God. v. 10a
 - 1. We have a special affection for one another, simply because we are brothers and sisters in Christ. 8:14-15 I John 5:1 4:9-11 3:10 I Th. 4:9

- 2. Just as there is no perfect family, there is no perfect church.
- 3. To be in a family, you have to have a thick skin.
- 4. In order to be a family, you must spend time together building relationships. 1 Thess: 2:17-3:13
- 5. Being part of the family involves serving and encouraging one another. 12:3-8 Co. 3:16 He. 10:24-25 Rom. 15:14
- 6. Being in a family makes you emotionally vulnerable. v. 15
- B. Do you have a familial affection for your fellow believers? II Co. 6:11-13
 - 1. Our church is a family.
 - 2. Some, however, are still on the fringe.
 - 3. Do you see the church as "them" or "us"?
 - 4. We need to work at deepening relationships in our church family.
 - 5. Our love is an important part of our witness.

V. Love shows honor. v. 10b

- A. Do you treat every member of the church family with respect? I Co. 12:23-24 1:26ff
 - 1. Don't seek honor for yourself. 12:3 Lu. 14:8-10 17:10 I Co. 13:4b-5b I Ti. 1:15
 - 2. Put others first. Phil. 2:3
 - 3. Treat everyone with respect. 15:7
- B. Encourage and appreciate one another.
 - 1. Commending one another is biblical. Rom. 1:8ff I Co. 1:4ff Phil. 1:3ff Rev. 2-3
 - 2. Value the gifts and graces of other believers.

VI. Concluding applications.

- A. People are starving for love which is sincere, discerning, caring, honoring.
- B. Our Lord Jesus exemplifies true love.
 - 1. He has proven the sincerity of His love. v. 9a John 15:13
 - 2. Jesus seeks our good and delivers us from wickedness. v. 9b Eph. 5:25ff Ti. 2:14
 - 3. Our Lord Jesus cares for us as His brethren. v. 10a 8:15,35 Mt. 12:46-50 Mk. 10:29-30
 - 4. Jesus put our interests ahead of His own. v. 10b Phil. 2:5 Rev. 2-3
 - 5. He makes us a community of love. I Co. 10:16-17
- C. He offers His love to you today.
- D. When you know His love, you can love as He loves. I John 4:19
