"You Must Be Born Again!" (Part 2) John 3:9-15 Reading: Matthew 6:25-34

...pray...

A *Pharisee* named *Nicodemus* came to *Jesus* at night with **three** *questions*, all reflecting his desire to have *eternal life*, but quickly revealing his *spiritual confusion*.

Question 1 (implied from v.3) – "How can I see the Kingdom of Heaven?"

Actually, Nicodemus was *beating around the bush*, but Jesus *knew* his heart and *cut* to the chase! Our Lord *asked* the Pharisee's question for him, and *gave* the world's most important instruction: "You must be born again!" 2X

Which lead the *aging Jewish leader* to ask his next question...

Question 2 (v.4) – "How can a man be born when he is old?"

Three times in **four** verses Jesus stresses that **rebirth** is **spiritual** birth:

v. 5 – "unless one is born of water and the Spirit"

v. 6 – "that which is born of the Spirit is spirit"

v.8 – "The wind blows where it wishes and you hear the sound of it, but do not know where it comes from or where it is going; so is everyone who is born of the Spirit."

And it in the midst of His answer, Jesus returned to His most important instruction (7): "You must be born again!"

Let's pick up that late-night conversation with Nicodemus' third question.

You might paraphrase it something like this: "Huh...?"

Open your Bible or *tap* your app to John 3. Nicodemus asks his *third* and *final* question in v.9 ... (read 9-15).

Nicodemus is *struggling to keep up!* But he *shouldn't* be!

He is "the teacher of Israel (10)" and these things are basic truths previewed in the Law and the Prophets. Any serious Jewish teacher should get that!

Yet he doesn't get it! And Jesus says so!

Let's *unpack* their conversation like this:

The greatest teacher in Israel asks his final question of the greatest teacher in the world.

In verses 9-12 we hear Nicodemus' third question and Jesus' stern rebuke.

In verses 13-15 we consider Jesus' illustration and final answer.

Nicodemus asks his *final question*...then says *no more* (vv. 9-12).

- 1. "How can these things be?" ... which being translated means: "Huh...?"
 - a. What Nicodemus means by "these things" are from Jesus' **second** answer in vv.5-8: the necessity of spiritual birth; the contrast between human birth and the work of the Spirit, how the **Spirit's** work is illustrated by the work of the wind, ...
 - **b.** And of course, "these things" certainly include that fundamental spiritual imperative (3,7): "You must be born again!"
 - **c.** "How can these things be...?"
- 2. Jesus answers Nicodemus by first rebuking Nicodemus.
 - a. The aging *Pharisees* has the reputation of be *the teacher of Israel!*Jesus' words and grammar are revealing: **not** "a teacher," but "the teacher of Israel."
 - i. If the Pharisees had a "*Teacher of the Year*" award, Nicodemus would have *snagged* that honor almost *annually*! But now the **teacher** can't solve life's most important **problem**.
 - ii. Yet the Pharisees spent hours a day *studying* and *memorized* vast portions of Scripture!
 - iii. Nicodemus should have *connected* several clear **OT** *previews* of the *new birth* (Jer, Ezek) straight to Jesus' teaching!
 - iv. "Why don't you get it, Nicodemus!?!"

- b. Then, for the **third** time in the interview, we hear Jesus rely "*Truly*, *truly*," and we know His answer is *on the way*.
 - i. Our Lord *draws a line* between *Himself* and His *disciples*. and *Nicodemus* and the *Jewish leaders* ("you," v.11.b is plural).
 - ii. Jesus' crew of *Galilean fishermen* move to the head of the class; the *Jerusalem teacher* is sent to sit in the corner!
 - 1. Jesus' teaching is *authoritative* (11); it is a *testimony* grounded in *eyewitness knowing* and *seeing*.
 - iii. Yet Nicodemus (Pharisees) *refuse to accept* the Galilean's testimony. Don't miss this important distinction in vv.11,12. Nicodemus' problem is **not** *understanding*, but *accepting*.
 - 1. V.11 you do **not accept** our testimony; v.12 you do **not helieve**.
 - 2. Back in **2:23-25**, we read that many "miracle chasers" in Jerusalem seemed to have a form of faith, but Jesus looked straight into their hearts and saw the shallowness of their faith, ... and that included the *Pharisees*.
 - 3. Nicodemus *refused to accept* that his Jewish *legalism* was not what God was looking for, and that only a radical spiritual *regeneration* can get you into God's kingdom.

- c. So Nicodemus **won't** *accept* Jesus' most *basic teachings* the Lord refers them (12) as *earthly things*. Jesus argues from *lesser* to *greater* from *earthly things* to *heavenly*.
 - i. If *Israel's premier professor* won't believe the basics (*spiritual birth*) how can he hope to graduate to the advanced, *heavenly truths* of the Kingdom? How can he ever *see the Kingdom*?
 - ii. You have to *walk* before you can *run*, and spiritually speaking, Israel's champion theologian was still *crawling* on his *hands* and *knees*!
 - iii. And again, to be clear, it wasn't an **IQ** issue, Nicodemus had a faith issue (11,12) "you do not accept, ... you do not believe."
- 3. **Isn't** it *interesting* that people say that they *want* God, but they refuse to *accept* God on God's *terms*?
 - a. Nicodemus was all in a dither about God's Kingdom & eternal life!
 - b. He even recognized that Jesus came from God.
 - c. But Nicodemus **couldn't** bring himself *to turn away* from his old way of life (*tradition*, *ritual*, *respect*), and to *accept* Jesus' message of *spiritual rebirth* of *starting over*!

Is that you? Are you trying to have God on your terms?

Friend, Jesus' final answer is that you only enter the Kingdom on His terms.

- 1. Do you remember that **first** *question*, the question Nicodemus *wanted* to ask (3)? *How can I see the Kingdom of God*?
 - a. Here comes Jesus' answer; it *begins* in v.13 and it *builds* all the way thru v.15 (**read vv.13-15**):
 - i. Do you see how v.13 **begins**: "No one..."? Do you see how v.13 **ends**: "the Son of Man"?
 - ii. How can you have eternal life? By "no one ...but...the Son of Man."
 - b. "Son of Man" is Jesus favorite title for Himself, and He is claiming to be the *long*-promised, *long* anticipated Messiah the only answer (way) to our questions about eternal life!
 - i. He offers *life everlasting* by His unprecedented *ascending* & *descending* to/from heaven.
 - ii. In other words, only Jesus **offers** the *Kingdom* of God **by** the *plan* of God **through** the *wisdom* of God because only Jesus has *come* from heaven with the plan, and then *returned*, having carried it out!
 - c. Months later, in the *Upper Room*, Jesus repeated these same truths (John 16:28): "I came forth from the Father and have come into the world; I am leaving the world again and going to the Father."

- 2. Jesus keeps *building* His answer, and then *undergirds* it for Nicodemus (14) with an *illustration* from **OT** book of **Numbers**.
 - a. **Num 21:5-9** (on the long journey to the Promised Land): The people spoke against God and Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no-food and no water, and we loathe this miserable food." The LORD sent fiery serpents among the people and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. So the people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned, because we have spoken against the LORD and you; intercede with the LORD, that He may remove the serpents from us." And Moses interceded for the people. Then the LORD said to Moses, "Make a fiery *serpent*, and set it on a standard; and it shall come about, that everyone who is bitten, *when he looks at it, he will live.*"

 And Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on the standard; and it came about, that if a serpent bit any man, when he looked to the bronze serpent, he lived. ... When any man looked, he lived!
 - b. God doesn't care much for *grumblers*, so when Israel *complained*, God *judged*. But when the people *repented* (7), God *relented*. His *remedy* for Israel's *complaining* was a *symbol* (*type*) for His coming *remedy* for *all* of mankind's *sin*: a *cross*, a *crucified Savior*, and *faith*.
 - c. Then (14) Jesus cuts to the *crucial connection* in His explanation:
 - i. The Son of Man must be lifted up.
 - ii. For the 2nd time Jesus *dons the mantle* of His favorite Messianic title –*Son of Man*. The *Son of Man* must be *lifted up*.
 - iii. To "be lifted up" often refers to the crucifixion in **NT** teachings, but can also be translated "exalted" or "glorified."
 - iv. And don't *skim past* that little command: "*must*"! The *Son of Man must* be crucified in the place of sinners, and sinners *must look to Him* to live...!
- 3. And so we come to Jesus' *promise* in **v.15** (**read**). *Eternal life* is made possible by the sin-paying *crucifixion* and death-defeating *resurrection* of Jesus, the payment *applied* to sinners through *believing* in Jesus....

- 4. Let's look back and *trace our way* through Jesus' *nighttime interview* with Nicodemus.
 - a. The *aging teacher* needed an answer: "How do you see the Kingdom?" (= "How do you have eternal life?")
 - b. Jesus replied, repeatedly: "You must be born again!"
 - c. But Nicodemus didn't get it! "How can these things be?"
 - d. Jesus unpacked the answer: ... by "No one but the Son of Man"
 - i. It's the "essential gospel," the Son of Man descended, crucified (lifted up), resurrected, and ascended to the Father's right hand!
 - ii. All of which demands *your* response: *faith* (10 understanding; 11 accept; 12 believe; 12 believe, 14 look(Num 21 look and live \Rightarrow to trust God's plan); 15 believe).

Here is Jesus' final answer (15), the Good News of the Gospel: "the Son of Man must be lifted up so that whoever believes will in Him have eternal

Nicodemus *struggled* to follow Jesus' teaching, but he **did** come with the right question: "*How can I have eternal life*?" I hope *you've* asked that question!

And Jesus' answer is still true – exclusively true:

- You must be born again! That's because you're dead... Your sin is the symptom of your spiritual death. You do sin (deed, word, thought, motive), you are a sinner (by nature), and so you are dead in your trespasses and sins.
- The **NT** tersely diagnoses you this way: "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God," because "you were dead in your transgressions."

God judges sinners. That's bad news!

- God is mankind's *Creator* and *King*, and your sin marks you as a *rebel*.
- When the rebel stands before the King, he'll be *judged* and *condemned*.
- It is appointed for men to die once, and after death comes judgement.
- Holy God's condemnation of *sinners* is *real* and *just*: it is *eternal* and *excruciatingly awful*.
- And God will allow only **one** of *two* people to *pay* for your sin.
- You or Jesus. You **don't** want it to be you...

So God's sent His one & only Son to pay for you sins in your place.

- As we've already seen in the *Gospel of John*, Jesus *existed* from all *eternity* as God's Son. Then at *just the right* time in history Jesus *descended from Heaven* He was born as the *miraculously conceived child* of Mary. Which means Jesus is *truly God* and *truly Man*. That combination of *deity* and *humanity* makes Jesus *uniquely qualified* to *pay* for our sins.
- That is what happened on the *cross*: *all* of the sins of *all* of Christ's people for *all* time were placed on Jesus, and God *punished* Him there for us!
- The New Testament says: But God demonstrates His own love for us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
- To prove to the world that God accepts Jesus' payment, He raised Christ from the grave on the **third** day (*Resurrection*).
- The Resurrection *also* proves that *eternal life* is God's gift to children; He *raised* Christ, He'll *raise* you! (*That's* what *Nicodemus was looking for!*)

But how - how can you know that Jesus' payment, pays for your sins? Here's how:

- Look to Christ, and Christ alone. The Bible teaches that the only condition for receiving God's forgiveness is faith and repentance.
- **Repent** (turn) by *turning away* from your *sins* and *selfishness* and *turn to* Jesus.
- *Trust* that Jesus *is* who He claims (The Son of God) and has *done* what He claims (*died* to pay for all your sins, *resurrected* on the 3rd day).
- If you look to Jesus, God will forgive you and give you spiritual life!

"the Son of Man must be lifted up so that whoever believes will **in Him** have eternal life."

Are you born again...?

I'll say it once more: "You must be born again!" ...pray...
