Introduction: The Entourage

Historically, the King rides into town amidst great fanfare

- I. The Final Ride
  - a. Lazarus had been brought back from the dead
  - b. In Bethany
  - c. Jesus had been Beyond the Jordan
  - d. "Let us also go, that we may die with Him." Doubting Thomas
  - e. Caiaphas seals Jesus fate "It is better for you that one man die for the people than that the whole nation perish."
  - f. A group follows Jesus from Bethany, a group comes out of the city to meet Him and a group meets Him inside the walls of the city.
  - g. Zech 9: 9 "See your King comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt the foal of a donkey.
- 11. The Stirring of Jerusalem
  - a. Jesus Mission was the cross
    - í. The bad news
    - ii. The worse news
    - iii. The good news
    - iv. No one but Jesus and maybe a very few others knew what this meant – so Jerusalem was torn between ultimate good – in Jesus Christ – and ultimate evil in the killing of the Lord of glory
    - v. Reminiscent of Matthew 2: 3 "When King Herod heard this he was disturbed and all Jerusalem with him."
