“Friends and Friendship Part 2”

Proverbs 27:11-21

11 My son, be wise, and make my heart glad, That I may answer him who reproaches me. 12 A prudent *man* foresees evil and hides himself; The simple pass on and are punished. 13 Take the garment of him who is surety for a stranger, And hold it in pledge *when* he is surety for a seductress. 14 He who blesses his friend with a loud voice, rising early in the morning, It will be counted a curse to him. 15 A continual dripping on a very rainy day And a contentious woman are alike; 16 Whoever restrains her restrains the wind, And grasps oil with his right hand. 17 As iron sharpens iron, So a man sharpens the countenance of his friend. 18 Whoever keeps the fig tree will eat its fruit; So he who waits on his master will be honored. 19 As in water face *reflects* face, So a man's heart *reveals* the man. 20 Hell and Destruction are never full; So the eyes of man are never satisfied. 21 The refining pot *is* for silver and the furnace for gold, And a man *is valued* by what others say of him.




