Avoiding a Spiritual Shipwreck

Christianity: Learning to Live 2 Peter 1:1-11 Pastor Phil Winfield March 4, 2012

...giving all diligence, add to your faith.. (2 Peter 1:5)

To avoid the shipwreck of our faith we must grow and mature. Growth happens by Getting to know God.

- o Getting to Know God reveals his grace to us. Verse 1-4
 - God's gracious <u>power</u> enables us (verse 3)
 - God's gracious <u>provision</u> establishes us
 - God's gracious <u>promises</u> encourage us
 - God's gracious <u>presence</u> indwells us
- Getting to know God requires true diligence of us.
 Verses 5-7 (Phil 2:12-13)
 - God's grace <u>gave us</u> faith to believe God, by his grace pursued us; we by his grace pursue godliness. 1 Tim 4:7
 - God's grace <u>empowers</u> our faith to work. It requires <u>all diligence</u> (quick eagerness) to grow verse 5
 - To faith we add virtue (**moral excellence**)
 - Virtue is based in Knowledge (<u>understanding</u>)
 - Resulting from knowledge is self-control (power over <u>indulgence</u> and passions)
 - Self-control leads to perseverance (**patience**)
 - Perseverance leads us to godliness (<u>right</u> worship)
 - Godliness is always reveled by brotherly love (<u>filial love</u>)

- Brotherly love is enabled by <u>divine</u> love (Rom 5:5)
- Getting to know God rewards the growth in us verses 8-11
 - Growing faith is not <u>useless</u> or fruitless verse 8
 - Growing faith is not <u>near sighted</u> or blind verse 9
 - Growing faith is not forgetful or <u>foolish</u> verse 9
 - Growing faith is not <u>lazy</u> or passive verse 10 (2 Cor. 13:5)
 - Growing faith is not <u>uncertain</u> or unstable verse 10
 - Growing faith is rewarded by a grand <u>reception</u> in <u>full measure</u> into the <u>endless</u> Kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ.

If we find ourselves incapable of the performance of the Christian graces perhaps we have never experienced <u>His Grace</u>.- *Php 2:13 For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him. (NLT)*
